Bruce Highway/Boundary Road Interchange upgrade Night works – bridge girder installation

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) advises there will be changed traffic conditions on the Bruce Highway and Boundary Road as night works are undertaken as part of the Bruce Highway/Boundary Road interchange upgrade project.

The next major milestone for this project will be to construct the new six-lane Boundary Road overpass bridge. The four-span bridge will require installing 68 pre-cast concrete girders to support the bridge platform.

Work to install the concrete girders will be done at night, outside of peak traffic times, and is scheduled to commence from late November. The works are anticipated to take place through December and will continue after the Christmas break into January 2017 weather and construction conditions permitting.

The girder placement will require night time intermittent lane closures on the Bruce Highway and ramp closures at Boundary Road. Traffic detours and diversions will be in place at night to allow for these works. During the day, traffic will operate us usual.

During the Bruce Highway lane closures and Boundary Road ramp closures for these works, motorists will be detoured up over the existing interchange or via the Deception Bay interchange. Traffic controls and signage will be in place to help motorists navigate the diversion and detour routes. The closed lanes and detours will be removed at the end of each night shift.

TMR encourages motorists to plan their journey and allow extra travel time during the closures and thanks motorists and the local community for their patience during construction. Nearby residents may experience some construction noise as a result of these works however the project team will endeavour to minimise impacts as much as possible.
