Labrador–Carrara Road (Ross Street) Night works

December 2015

About the project

Sections of Labrador–Carrara Road (also known locally as Ross Street and Currumburra Road) will be upgraded and the existing roundabout at Ashmore Road converted to a signalised intersection.

This \$30 million project is designed to improve performance through the intersection, reducing traffic congestion, traffic delays and queue lengths, while improving traffic flows and safety for all road users.

Drainage works for the upgraded intersection will be taking place during December 2015.

Works include saw cutting and excavation to remove the kerb and median, installation of drainage pipes and temporary asphalt crossings across all four legs of the roundabout.

What to expect

- This work program starts on Monday
 7 December and will continue until
 Friday 18 December 2015.
- Standard work hours are 6am to 10pm Monday to Friday. However, some work activities will continue after 10pm due to traffic volumes and the type of work.
- Night time work hours are 10pm to 5am Sundays to Thursdays.

- Lane closures and stop/slow traffic control will be in place.
- At various times local residents may experience short-term impacts such as changed lighting, noise and vibration from construction activities.
- The project team has strategies in place to minimise impacts wherever possible, however your patience and understanding is appreciated.
- To ensure everyone's safety the speed limit in the area will be reduced to 40km/h at all times while this project is underway.

It is important to note that this work schedule depends on weather, site and contractor conditions and may change without notice.
