## Kinsellas Road East bridge - extended hours of work

**Work on the bridge foundations and embankments has been progressing rapidly, with the bridge piers and abutments completed.**

Some important activities will require us to start work earlier than the usual time of 6.30am. The early start times on the following dates will ensure that the equipment and resources required for these activities are available and so that hot weather does not adversely affect concrete curing.

### Dates and activities

- **Wednesday 12 to Friday 14 December**  
**5am – 6pm**  
*Installing girders to span the bridge*
- **Late January, 4.30am – 6pm**  
*Concrete pouring on the bridge*

### What to expect

- Work is being carried out within the site area.
- Cranes, large semi-trailers and concrete trucks will generate some noise.
- For safety reasons, delivery of large girders and concrete may require short term stop/hold traffic control.
- Traffic controllers will ensure the safety of road users and pedestrians.

We will provide more details about the concreting in early January 2013. Every effort will be made to minimise disturbance during these works and we will continue to keep you informed in advance of any extended working hours. The bridge and new road connections will be completed by mid 2013.

### Fast Fact

100,000 cubic metres of earth - the equivalent to more than 40 Olympic sized swimming pools - has been used to construct the ramps approaching the bridge.

## Traffic - new connections and changes

From mid January 2013 additional road works will start at both the Mango Hill Boulevard and Anzac Avenue intersections with Kinsellas Road East. This will make it possible to create road connections to the new bridge approaches.

The work includes:

- connecting Mango Hill Boulevard to a new roundabout at the Kinsellas Road East intersection
- realigning Kinsellas Road East slightly east of the current road
- installing new traffic islands and kerbs at the Anzac Avenue intersection.

This work will occur during the daytime and will involve changed traffic conditions. We will provide more details in early January 2013.

In mid October we made a minor change to the lane width for traffic turning right into Kinsellas Road East from Anzac Avenue. This will remain in place until March 2013.

## Earthworks completed

Earthworks along the rail corridor between Halpine Lake and Kinsellas Road East is now complete. During December we will continue seeding the area with grass.
