Kinsellas Road East bridge progress

The Moreton Bay Rail Link is set to transform the region, providing a dedicated public transport link for one of the fastest growing areas in the country.

Work on a new road-over-rail bridge is underway and progressing well, with construction on track to be completed by mid-2013, weather permitting.

These roadworks have been brought forward to ensure the local community remains connected once rail construction works start in 2013. In addition to construction of the new bridge, Kinsellas Road East will be slightly realigned to the east of the current road.

What to expect

Earthworks – to be completed by December 2012

In July 2012, major earthworks started along the rail corridor west of Kinsellas Road East. This involves excavating soil from within the rail corridor and transporting it to the site to build the bridge embankments.

The majority of these earthworks will be completed by the end of September, with the remainder expected to be completed by December 2012. We will continue to make every effort to minimise dust impacts from the earthworks, including continued use of water trucks to wet down the excavated areas.

Speed reductions and temporary stop-go arrangements will also remain in place during the earthworks to provide access for construction vehicles crossing Kinsellas Road East.

When the earthworks have been completed, the corridor will be fenced and seeded with grass.

We appreciate your patience as we continue to work near residences and adjacent to Kinsellas Road East.

Traffic – temporary changes

In mid-September a temporary change to line marking will remove the dedicated right turning lane from Kinsellas Road East into Mango Hill Boulevard. Motorists will still be able to turn right into Mango Hill Boulevard from the single lane. This change will allow the team to safely continue construction adjacent to the road.

Bridge construction progress

The first signs of the bridge taking shape will be seen in early October, with the first bridge piers coming out of the ground, following completion of the concrete piles for the bridge foundations in late September. (Piling to construct foundations shown below.)

Working hours are Monday to Saturday, 6.30am to 6.30pm. Some out-of-hours works may be required and we will keep you informed in advance. Please contact us if you have any queries about the work.
