MPPL Planning Study

Refined planning option released!

The Department of Transport and Main Roads and Brisbane City Council have released the refined planning option for the upgrade of the Miles Platting, Padstow and Logan Roads (MPPL) intersection and surrounding road network.

The refined planning option has been developed by considering both key issues raised by the community during the planning study, along with further technical investigations carried out by the project team.

Key issues investigated

Following a review of the feedback received during Stage 2 community consultation, the project team have identified and investigated further the following key issues:

- Potential property impacts as a result of the upgrade
- Proposed accessibility changes to the north-east residential precinct:
- Access from Mersey Street onto Miles Platting Road should be retained.
- Allowing for right-turn out of London Street onto Logan Road. Current accessibilty is left-turn in and left-turn out only.
- Concerns about the loss of left-turn in and left-turn out at Liverpool Street.
- Concerns about the use of the parkland at the end of Manchester Street for a new road connection providing safe signal controlled all-turns access onto Miles Platting Road. (from Manchester Street to Buckingham Place)
- The need to investigate the potential to signalise all turns at Miles Platting Road and Mersey Street.
- > To maintain left-turn out as well as left-in accessibility at Logan Road and Bleasby Road intersection.
- Concern about parking in the streets to the north-east of the MPPL intersection due to overflow requirements from nearby commercial operations as well as the Eight Mile Plains Busway Station.
- Manchester street, from Mersey Street east to Buckingham Place, is too narrow to cope with additional through traffic.


BCC project update - Padstow Road and Warrigal Road intersection upgrade

Brisbane City Council is continuing with the detailed design and required land acquisitions for the upcoming upgrade of the Padstow Road and Warrigal Road intersection.

The preferred upgrade option was presented to the community for comment in November 2008. Construction is due to commence in early 2010, and is scheduled to be completed by early 2011.

The upgrade will result in significant improvements for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists.

The MPPL planning study is investigating local issues and exploring opportunities to improve the operation of these intersections and the surrounding road network into the future.

A preferred planning option for the upgrade of the Miles Platting, Padstow and Logan Roads intersection and surrounding road network was developed and released to the community for feedback in February 2009.

The MPPL planning study project team has since refined and finalised the preferred planning option, following feedback from the community and further detailed technical investigations.

The refined planning option involves widening the intersection to include additional through and turning lanes.

The option also looked at the surrounding road network including:

- providing a bus only connection from Warrigal Road north connecting into the Logan Road/Pacific Motorway northbound offramp intersection
- upgrading the intersection of Logan Road and the Pacific Motorway northbound off-ramp
- upgrading and installing traffic signals at the intersection of Buckingham Place, McKechnie Drive and Miles Platting Road (entry to Brisbane Technology Park).

The refined planning option delivers long-term traffic management capacity and improved safety for the intersection. The upgrade design has allowed for possible staged construction to reduce congestion within the area as funding becomes available.
