

Pacific Motorway Upgrade Project, Springwood (south) to Daisy Hill

Welcome to the first project construction update for 2012. The Pacific Motorway Upgrade from Springwood (south) to Daisy Hill is the first priority stage to upgrade the Pacific Motorway between the Gateway and Logan motorways.



Works on the motorway

Asphalting works are continuing on the motorway to improve the road surface. Due to safety and traffic flow requirements these works must be undertaken at night between Sundays and Thursdays. Some noise, lane closures/realignments and minor traffic delays can be expected during works.

Loganlea Road

The new Loganlea Road on-ramp is open to traffic, with final works scheduled for completion in early 2012, weather permitting.

Nujooloo Road bikeway

Landscaping and pavement works for the new bikeway at Nujooloo Road are currently underway, with completion scheduled for early 2012, weather permitting. Construction activities will continue in this area until late 2012, weather permitting, while works are completed at the new park 'n' ride.

Winnetts Road/John Paul Drive

As part of the closure of the old southbound Winnetts Road off-ramp, construction of a cul-de-sac on Winnetts Road connecting to Village Drive is currently scheduled to start in March 2012.

Current works near John Paul Drive include earthworks, installation of drainage and construction of noise barriers. Direct access from Winnetts Road to John Paul Drive will be provided permanently, with traffic able to turn right onto John Paul Drive when travelling from the west.

Signals at the new Winnetts Road/Loganlea Road intersection will be fully operational in early 2012, weather permitting.

Western service road

Upgrade works on the western service road between Elonera Drive and the Paradise Road roundabout are expected to be completed in early 2012, weather permitting.

Safety and access

Please take care when travelling around roadwork. Traffic changes will be signposted and traffic controllers will be in place to direct motorists, pedestrians and cyclists as required. Detours for pedestrian and cycle paths are also in place where required.

Please slow down - Roadwork safety is your responsibility too.



New southbound motorway lane

Works started in January this year to construct an additional southbound motorway lane between Aranda Street and the Chatswood Road off-ramp (Exit 23), with completion expected by late 2012.

Once completed, this additional lane will provide increased motorway capacity, improving access and safety and reducing congestion and travel time. This will make it safer and easier for motorists to merge when entering and exiting the motorway.

The existing southbound Chatswood Road on and off-ramps will also be modified as part of these works.

Construction activities during February and March 2012 will include minor realignment of the eastern service road, drainage works and retaining wall construction.

The motorway speed limit will remain at 80 km/h and the speed limit on the eastern service road will be reduced to 40 km/h at times during construction for the safety of motorists and roadworkers.

Slacks Creek park 'n' ride

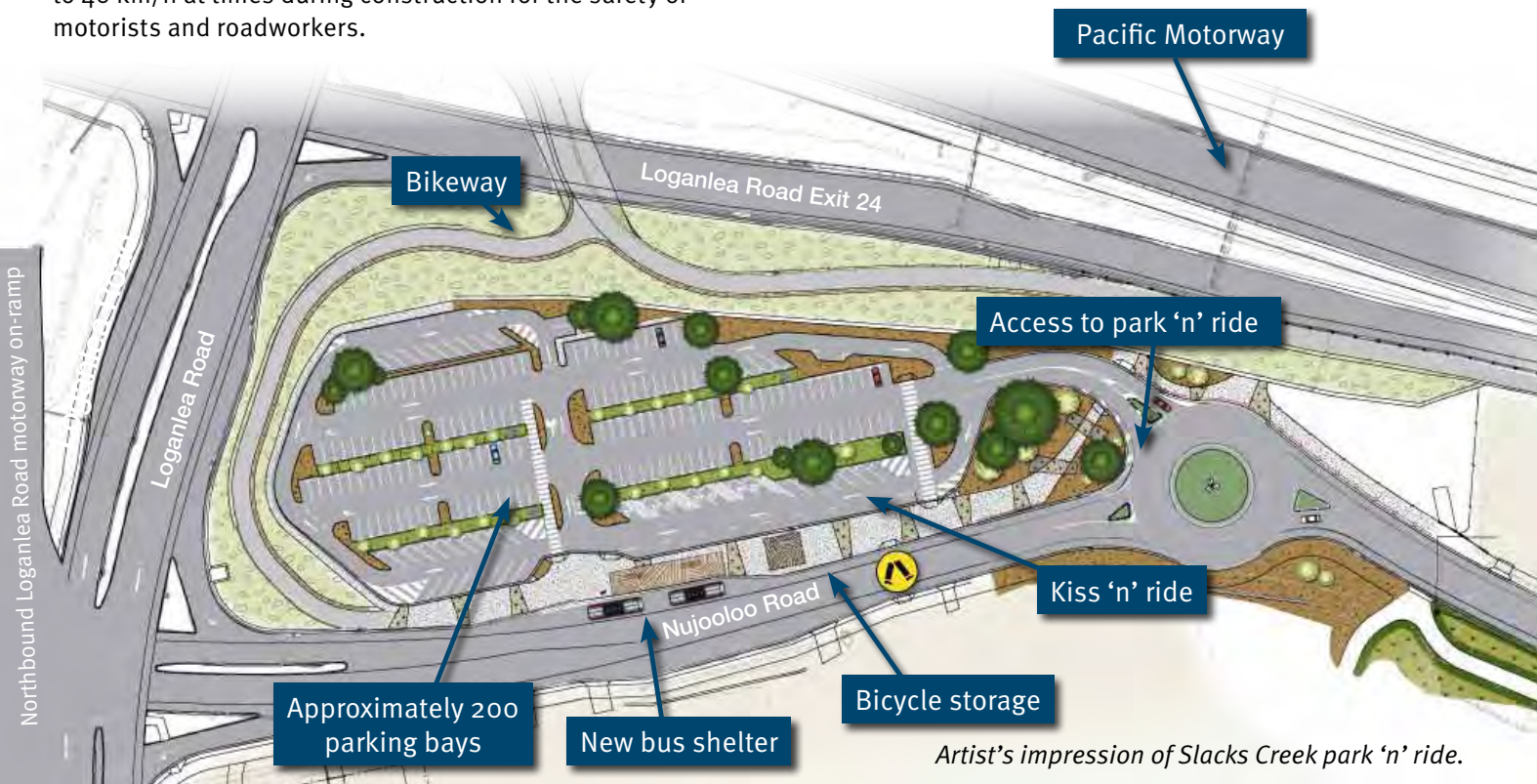
Early works for the new park 'n' ride, to be located on the corner of Loganlea and Nujooloo Roads, started in January 2012. Current activities include service relocation and drainage works.

The new park 'n' ride will provide a high-quality and safe environment for commuters to park their cars and transfer to a bus.

The final design includes approximately 200 parking spaces, a passenger drop-off area (called a kiss 'n' ride), bicycle storage, a sheltered waiting platform with seating, security cameras, lighting and 24-hour video recording.

Construction of the new park 'n' ride is scheduled for completion in late 2012, weather permitting.
