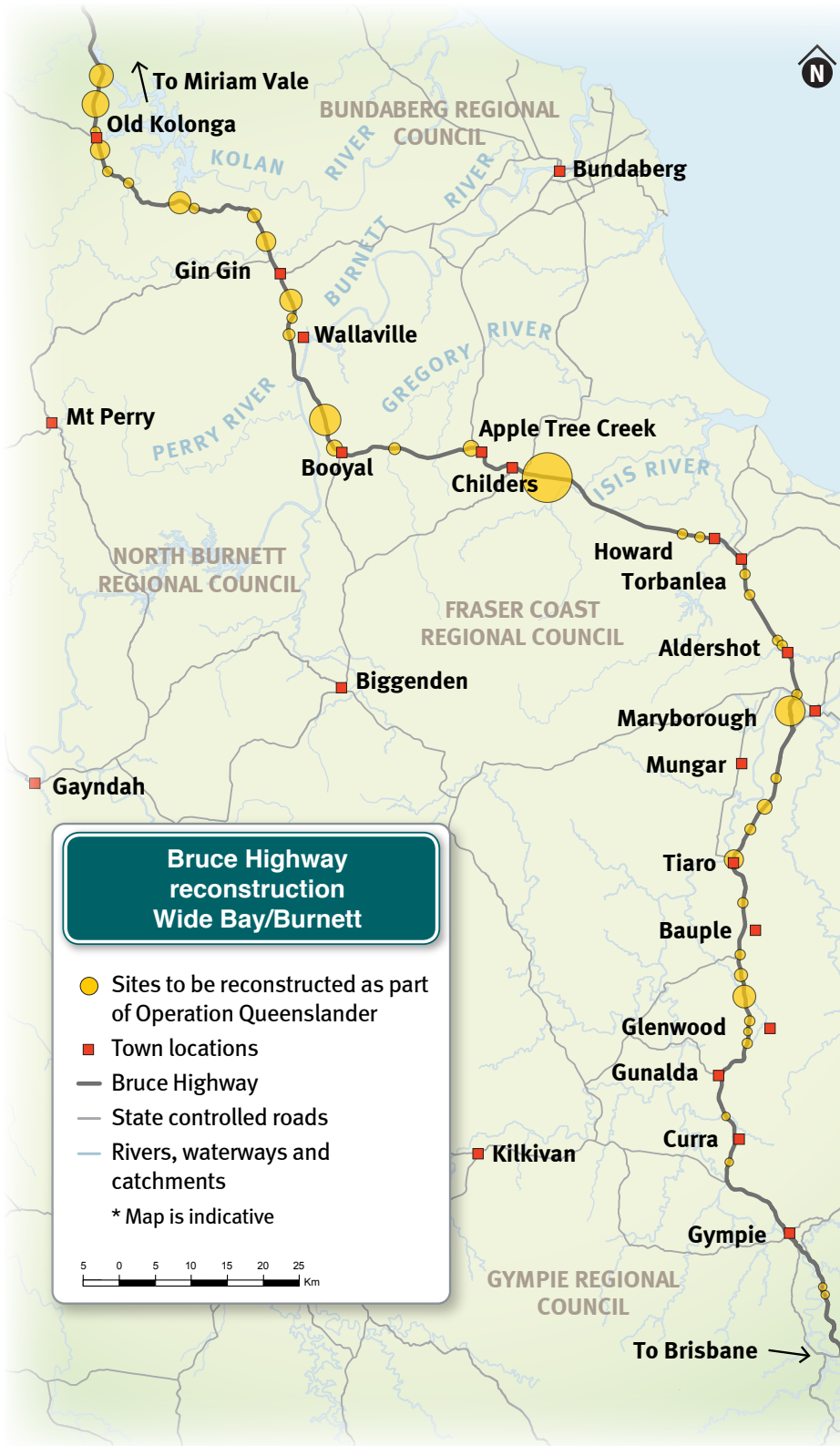


Wide Bay/Burnett region Bruce Highway reconstruction works – July 2012



In addition to ongoing Department of Transport and Main Roads works on the Bruce Highway, Operation Queenslander reconstruction works will start in July 2012, weather permitting.

The works will involve shoulder widening, stabilisation and pavement overlay to reconstruct flood and rain-damaged sections of the Bruce Highway between just south of Gympie and the Kolan River, north of Gin Gin. Works will take place between 6 am and 6 pm from Monday to Saturday, with some out-of-hours work possible.

Traffic controllers, single lane closures and speed restrictions will be used as required so please drive to the changed traffic conditions and obey all signage for the safety of all motorists and roadworkers. Motorists can expect some delays and should factor in additional travel time to their journey.

Operation Queenslander is the largest reconstruction effort in Queensland's history, rebuilding communities, fixing infrastructure and restoring regional economies.

This program of works is being delivered under Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA), a joint federal and state initiative. Under these arrangements, the Australian Government provides 75% of the funding, with 25% from the Queensland Government.
