Vegetation clearing and service relocation work

The Department of Transport and Main Roads is undertaking vegetation clearing followed by the relocation of services on Mount Cotton Road, Burbank to prepare the area for the upcoming Mount Cotton Road stage 1 works.

What we are delivering

The department will shortly start work to relocate services on Mount Cotton Road, between Mount Gravatt-Capalaba Road and Moxon Road and between Priest Gully and Stockyard Creek.

Before services can be relocated, vegetation along sections of the roadway will need to be removed.

Timing

Clearing and service relocation works are scheduled to start late October/early November 2010 and should be completed by early 2011, weather permitting.

Works will take place Monday to Friday between 7am and 4pm. However, some weekend work may be required.

Construction impacts

There may be some traffic changes in place and motorists are encouraged to drive safely around the roadworks.

There will also be some noise associated with these works. The department will make every effort to keep disruptions to a minimum and apologies for any inconvenience.

Please slow down – roadwork safety is your responsibility too.

Construction updates

The department will continue to liaise with the community as construction begins for Section A, stage 1 works.

Look out for project flyers in your letterbox and advertisements in local papers about upcoming construction activities.

Redland Corridor Program update – Section A: Mount Cotton Road Upgrade

As you maybe aware, the department is progressing with plans to upgrade three sections of road in the Redlands area, which form the Redland Corridor Program. These include:

- SECTION A: Mt Gravatt-Capalaba Road, Mt Cotton Road from Grieve Road to Upper Tingalpa Creek
- SECTION B: Broadwater, Mt Cotton and Duncan Roads from Upper Tingalpa Creek to Taylor Road
- SECTION C: Cleveland-Redland Bay Road from South Street to Boundary Road

Initial planning involved duplicating the road sections from two to four lanes. While funding is not yet available for this work, the department recognises the need to address high priority safety areas in each section. These safety upgrades will be known as Stage 1 works.

Stage 1 works in Section A consists of:

- Replacing the roundabout with a signalised intersection at Mount Cotton Road and Mount Gravatt-Capalaba Road
- Signalising Mount Cotton Road and Alperton Road intersection
- Localised widening and right turn lanes at Oakridge Street and Moxon Road
- Extending Daymar Street to provide a service road for properties currently accessing directly onto Mount Cotton Road
- Providing fauna over/underpasses and associated fauna fencing
- Upgrading existing bus stops
- Incorporating provisions for pedestrians and commuter cyclists.

After receiving the permit for vegetation clearing from the Department of Environment and Resource Management in June 2010, the department is now progressing with vegetation clearing and the relocation of services on Mount Cotton Road, Burbank to prepare the area for Stage 1 works.

Please find information overleaf on clearing and service relocation works due to commence shortly in your area.


The main construction phase for Stage 1 works is due to commence mid 2011 and is expected to be complete by mid 2012, weather permitting.
