1.0	Welcome and introductions - Suzi Woodrow-Read Apologies received from Peter Murphy, Raymond Murray, Stan Been, Dr Choung Bui and South West Neighbouring Communities.

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	<p>The following questions and issues were raised during and following this presentation.</p> <p>Q: With an Alliance delivering the project, who would an external party take legal action against?</p> <p>A: Any legal action would be brought against the Queensland Government and/or the individual parties to the SAFELink Alliance.</p> <p>Q: How is SAFELink Alliance communicating with Brisbane City Council in regards to the closure of the Bullockhead Street off-ramp?</p> <p>A: Regular meetings are held between SAFELink Alliance, Main Roads and Brisbane City Council to discuss the closure of the Bullockhead Street off-ramp.</p>
<p>3.0</p>	<p>Introductions, CLG roles and responsibilities - Suzi Woodrow-Read</p> <p>All CLG members and project team representatives in attendance introduced themselves, the community interests/groups they represent and that they hope to achieve by being a CLG member.</p> <p>Suzi Woodrow-Read walked the group through the draft <i>CLG Charter and Procedures</i> which details the purpose of the CLG and operational protocols, including the roles and responsibilities of both CLG members and the project team.</p> <p>All CLG present endorsed the draft <i>CLG Charter and Procedures</i> without change.</p> <p>Comment made about a lack of representation on the CLG for Wacol residents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Details of additional CLG member to represent views of Wacol residents has been provided to the project team for consideration. <p>ACTION: CLG Coordinator to liaise with Wacol Action Group to assess interest in being a CLG member.</p> <p>STATUS: Complete – Wacol Action Group now a member of the CLG.</p>
<p>4.0</p>	<p>Community Engagement - Kyle Roggenkamp</p> <p>Kyle Roggenkamp provided a detailed overview of the community engagement approach to support the Ipswich Motorway Upgrade: Wacol to Darra project. Topics included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Previous community engagement and key issues ▪ Community engagement objectives during construction ▪ Likely community impacts during construction

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Tools to inform the community about impacts <p>Q: How long does it usually take to get through to someone on the project's 1800 number?</p> <p>A: The 1800 is answered 24 hours a day unless the line is busy at which time it will revert to message bank. The project team will endeavour to respond to all messages within 4 hours of receipt.</p>
5.0	<p>Questions and Answers - CLG members</p> <p>This session gave CLG members an opportunity to voice their key concerns and/or areas of interest at this stage of the project to ensure future CLG meetings are tailored to meet their information needs.</p> <p>Concern raised about the amount of dust being created by the project and that residents were using potable water to wash their cars.</p> <p>- Project team acknowledged that at this current stage of the project, with significant earthworks underway, there will be some dust impacts on the local community. Every effort is being made to mitigate dust through various mechanisms.</p> <p>Q: Is the Alliance open to suggestions on managing issues such as dust reduction?</p> <p>A: Yes, within reason.</p> <p>Q: Who do people contact in regards to environmental impacts, dust etc? What is the process?</p> <p>A: Contact SAFElink Alliance via the 1800 number or by email and place your enquiry with the community engagement team. Once this is done the team will investigate the issue further and provide a response as soon as possible.</p> <p>Q: What is the exact location of the new Bullockhead and Sandy Creek bridges?</p> <p>A: Bridges are shown on project overview map in community newsletter. Duncan Gibb provided additional details on enlarged map at meeting.</p> <p>Q: Will the Progress Road interchange be changed as part of this project?</p> <p>A: At this stage any upgrade of the Progress Road interchange is not within the scope of this project, however traffic monitoring and design options are being conducted in anticipation of the eventual upgrade.</p> <p>Q: Does the upgrade include establishment of bikeways?</p> <p>A: Yes, along certain parts of the Centenary Highway and Ipswich Motorway. Duncan Gibb provided details on enlarged map at meeting.</p>

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6.0	<p>Other business – CLG members</p> <p>Site tour - general agreement that a site tour would help members understand the scope of the project. ACTION: CLG Coordinator to organise site tour. STATUS: Planning underway.</p> <p>Next meeting - general agreement that a representative from the SAFElink Alliance Environmental Team provide more information about the project approach to environmental management - general agreement that more detailed information on bikeways be provided</p>
