

USE OF YELLOW RAISED RETROREFLECTIVE PAVEMENT MARKERS AND YELLOW DELINEATORS ON GUIDE POSTS AND BARRIERS

This is supplementary information on changes to delineation standards in Part 2 MUTCD.

Changes in delineation standards are included in the Manual of Uniform Control Devices Part 2: Traffic control devices for general use, which was amended in May 2009. (Reference Page 2-138).

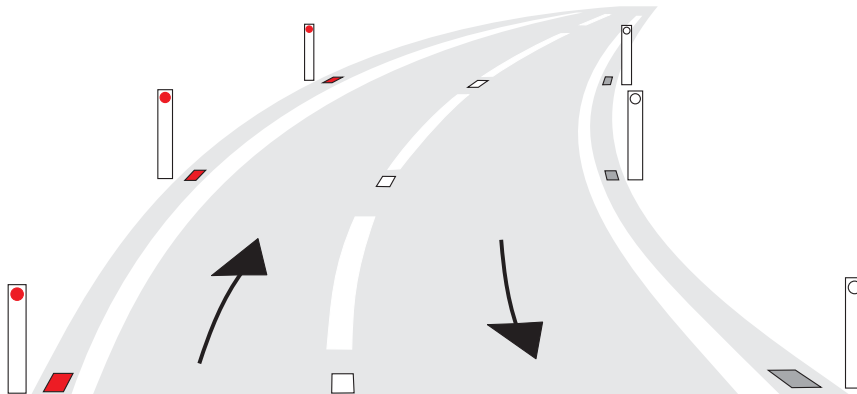
The changes to delineation standards are:

- RRPMs used to supplement dividing lines are to be yellow instead of white;
- Delineators on guide posts and safety barriers on the right hand side of one-way roadways (including on medians of divided roads) are to be yellow instead of white.

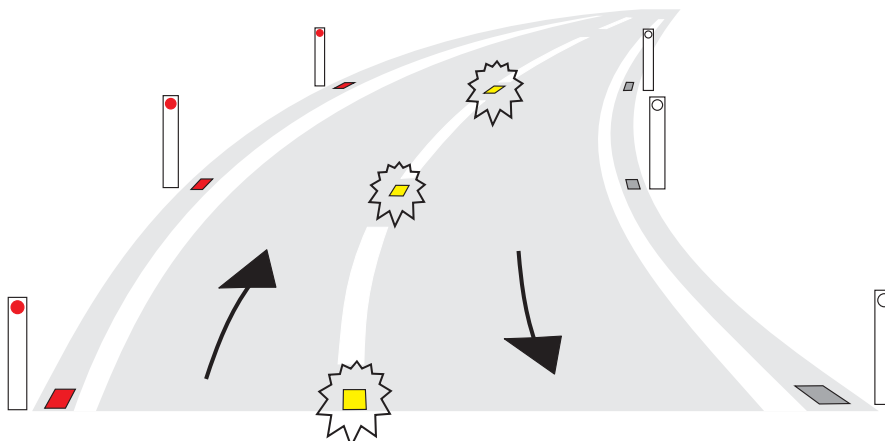
The changes in standards are illustrated in the following figures.

- **Use of yellow RRPMs on dividing lines of two-way roads:**

New Standard:

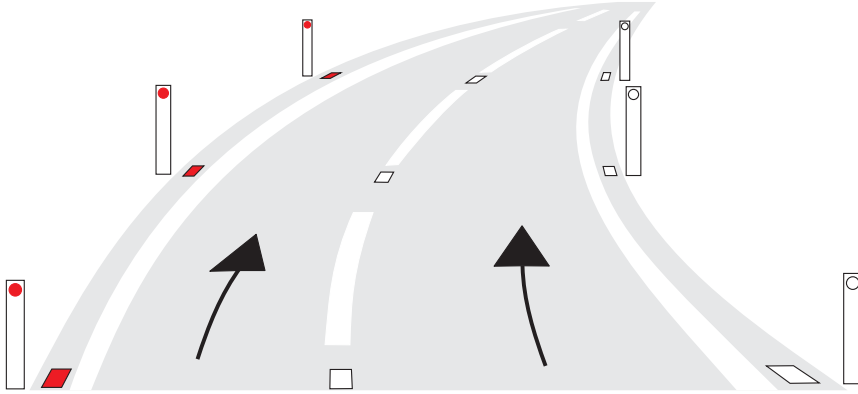

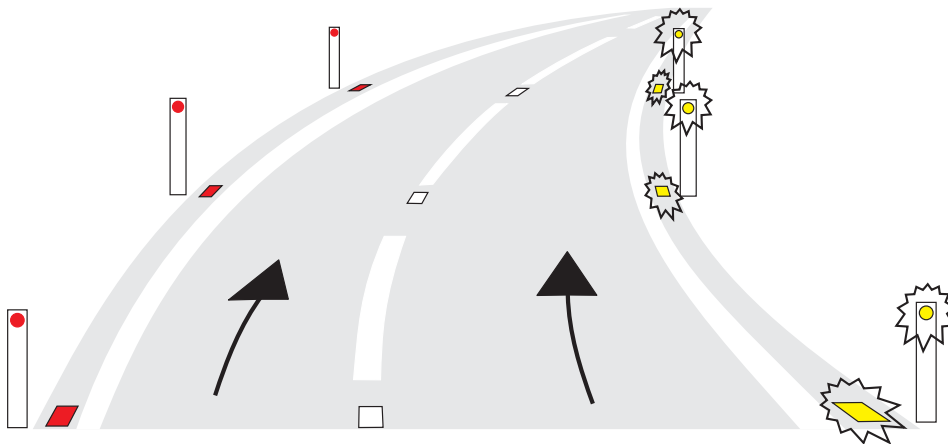
Note: Dividing lines are lines separating lanes of traffic travelling in opposite directions. The changes do not apply to **lane** lines or **edge** lines.
