## Operator Accreditation Training

The *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Standard 2010*, section 19, authorises the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) to specify training requirements for operator accreditation (OA).

To fulfil the training requirement, operators must either—

- Complete the TMR Operator Accreditation Training Workbook (OA Workbook); or
- Hold an equivalent qualification recognised by TMR. Refer to Attachment 1 for information about acceptable qualifications.

OA applicants who hold a qualification recognised by TMR may be issued with OA for up to five years. Applicants who are required to complete the OA Workbook may only obtain provisional OA for a three month period, during which time the workbook must be finalised. Once the workbook has been successfully completed, OA can be issued for up to five years. If the workbook is not completed during the three month period, the accreditation will not be renewed, preventing the operator from continuing to provide a public passenger service.

The OA Workbook must be completed by a person listed on the OA application. If the person who satisfies the training requirement subsequently leaves a business or association, the training requirement does not need to be completed again. The entity will retain full OA.

There are various categories of OA and the requirements within the OA Workbook differ according to the category of OA required. If an OA holder wishes to obtain an additional category of OA, they must complete the relevant requirements applicable to that category.

To obtain the OA Workbook, complete the OA training workbook request located on the last page of the [OA application form \(F2982\)](#), lodge the form at a TMR customer service centre and pay the required fee of \$65.

There is also an assessment fee payable directly to an independent TMR approved assessor. Details of assessors are provided with the workbook. In addition to assessing workbooks, an assessor's role includes providing limited assistance to a person completing a workbook.
