### About the works

As part of the Smith Street and Kumbari Avenue intersection improvements underground drainage investigations are required.

Lane closures on both Smith Street westbound and Kumbari Avenue will be in place during these investigations because workers will need access to the kerbside traffic lanes.

Due to traffic volumes and to ensure the safety of road workers, this work will be completed during night time hours.

### What to expect

- Night work is scheduled **from 7pm to 6am on Wednesday 7 December 2016.**
- The left-turn lane from Kumbari Avenue to Smith Street will be closed with left-turning movements made from the through lane if required.
- The westbound lane on Smith Street closest to the kerbside will also be closed.
- Residents near to the work zone will experience increased noise as concrete cutting and drilling are required. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts wherever possible.
- Motorists can also expect reduced speed limits and traffic controllers on site. Drive to conditions, allow extra travel time and choose alternative routes if possible.
- Public transport users are reminded the existing bus stop westbound on the Smith Street Motorway near the intersection is temporarily closed. Visit [www.translink.com.au](http://www.translink.com.au) for alternative bus stop locations.
- Pedestrians and cyclists should follow detour signage, be mindful of changed paths and keep personal safety top of mind.
