Works Notification – Veloway 1 Stage E

Dear Stakeholder,

Veloway 1 Stage E – start of construction

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) would like to advise that construction of Veloway 1 Stage E, between Gaza Road, Tarragindi and Birdwood Road, Holland Park West will soon commence.

About the project

Veloway 1 (V1) Stage E will provide a dedicated cycleway from Birdwood Road, Holland Park West, to the existing Veloway facilities at Gaza Road, Tarragindi.

This project will include dedicated cycle bridges over Marshall Road, Sterculia Avenue and Bapaume Road near Gaza Road. Removing multiple road crossings will provide a safer route for people to cycle.

There will be new access points to the cycleway constructed at Bapaume Road, opposite Peronne Road, as well as ramp connections from Gaza Road and the south side of Birdwood Road.

Timing

Preliminary site establishment works for V1 Stage E will commence **late August 2018/early September 2018**.

The project is expected to be completed by mid-2020, weather and construction conditions permitting. Works on Stage E will soon be underway from 7am to 5pm, Monday to Saturday.

Some night works will be required to minimise traffic impacts and for the safety of the road workers and general travelling public. Residents and businesses will be notified in more detail prior to any significant night works commencing, and every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.

What to expect

The majority of construction works is going to be constructed on a narrow corridor between the Pacific Motorway and Bapaume Road.

Throughout the construction period, local residents may experience temporary impacts including noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of machinery such as piling rigs, excavators and vehicles along the works area.

The design of the bikeway is aimed at minimising loss of vegetation by utilising as many elevated structures as possible with the preferred alignment traversing the existing disturbed footprint, however there will be unavoidable loss of trees and shrubs.

Construction activities will be required at night to minimise disruption to road users and critical services such as water, power and gas. Localised lighting may also be required in some areas and will be powered by portable generators.

Pedestrians and cyclists should expect changed conditions, including detours, intermittent closures and other traffic control measures.

Motorists should expect changed conditions, including speed limit restrictions, temporary loss of parking spaces, partial lane closures and other traffic control measures throughout the work site.



TMR will make every effort to keep disruptions to a minimum and apologises for the inconvenience.
