

# Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Tertiary Scholarship Terms and conditions

## Scholarship title:

Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Tertiary Scholarship

#### Governed by:

Program Delivery and Operations (PDO), Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR)

## **Purpose:**

To assist eligible Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to undertake a degree or diploma course in engineering or engineering related qualifications, that supports the Queensland transport infrastructure industry, and to progress a career in their chosen profession.

#### Number of scholarships:

Multiple scholarships are available.

#### Value:

Full-time – \$6000 per annum for the length of the qualification

Part-time – \$3000 per annum for the length of the qualification (pro rata).

## **Duration of scholarship:**

The scholarship will be for the continuing duration of the chosen engineering or engineering related degree or diploma.

#### **Concurrent scholarships:**

The scholarship may not be held concurrently with any other scholarships except a Commonwealth Scholarship or university-funded scholarship or award.

# **Eligibility requirements:**

To be eligible for the scholarship, a candidate must be an:

- a) Australian Citizen
- b) Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are people who:

- are of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person
- are accepted as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person in the community in which he or she lives or has lived.

## Eligibility to take up:

To be eligible to take up a scholarship, a recipient must be:

- a) enrolled full-time or part-time at an Australian tertiary institution in a degree or diploma course
- b) enrolled in an engineering or engineering related qualification that supports the

transport infrastructure industry

 able to work at least 30 days paid employment at a nominated departmental workplace each year. The host locations for the scholarship holder will be in Toowoomba, Bundaberg and Brisbane. Only one scholarship will be offered for each location.

# **Selection process:**

The selection panel will have regard to the applicant's enrolled qualification, academic enrolment and records, completed application and supporting documentation. Preference will be given for regional and rural locations.

#### **Payment:**

Maximum of two equal instalments of \$3000 per semester, to a maximum of \$6000 per year (pro rata for part-time), paid when academic results are released in each semester.

# **Criteria for continuation:**

The recipient must:

- a) continue to meet eligibility
- b) work at least 30 days in paid employment at a departmental workplace each year
- c) uphold the principles of the Code of Conduct for the Queensland public service.

# Suspension of scholarship:

The scholarship may be paused:

- a) after the first academic semester following the commencement of the scholarship
- b) for up to two semesters during the tenure of the scholarship subject to approval by TMR.

## **Application procedure:**

Applications must be submitted online by the advertised closing date at:

www.tmr.qld.gov.au/scholarships.

## **Student opportunity:**

The scholarship will provide you an opportunity to work a minimum 30 days per year paid employment and to apply for the TMR Graduate Program upon successful scholarship completion.

#### **Other conditions:**

The scholarship offer must be taken up in the semester for which it is awarded.
