

Queensland Transport and Roads Investment Program 2020–21 to 2023–24

Snapshot – Metropolitan Region

An area of about 2965km², around 0.2 per cent of Queensland.

Estimated residential population of 1.5 million people, around 32 per cent of Queensland's total population.

Responsible for 438kms of statecontrolled road network, 89kms of National Land Transport Network, marine infrastructure, busway assets and cycleways.

Includes 97 per cent of Queensland's busways, 67 per cent of Transport and Main Roads assets and 56kms of cycleways.

Our key challenges

Plant – Peak demand, specialist equipment.



People – Attraction, retention, turnover.



Materials - Peak demand periods.


