

Infringement data undertaken by Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ) enforcement patrols in an area of the Coomera River, specifically the 6 knot zone up river from the yellow mark located at the bifurcation of the north and south branch off Sanctuary Cove Marina to the western end of the 6 knot zone when entering the Santa Barbara reach:

1. The dates and times that a patrol entered that area during the period from 1 December 2021 to 28 February 2022.
2. The time spent in that zone.
3. Number of infringements issued.
4. Number of infringements with penalty units.

<p><b>Time spent in the zone.</b></p>	<p>No data available as the time range of the scope is outside the reportable time as the MSQ GPS trackers are on a loop of 3 months.</p> <p>Each patrol undertaken by the Maritime Enforcement Team (MET) commences upstream of the 6 knot zone, so would have visited on at least 2 occasions for each patrol with an average time per patrol of 1 hour in the area, therefore approximately 10 hours.</p>
