



Working in Proximity to Traffic – Awareness Part 1

Overview

On completion of this program participants will:

- gain the ability to identify hazards at work sites on roads
- be able to confirm the personnel responsible for selecting and implementing works protection methods have followed the process necessary to ensure the safety of workers.

Working in Proximity to Traffic is a training competency within the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) Part 3, clause 1.4.3. To receive a certificate of completion, you must complete a quiz and receive an 80% pass mark.

Working in Proximity to Traffic – Awareness Part 1 is a prerequisite for the eLearning program *Working in Proximity to Traffic – Awareness Part 2 Works Protection Methods*.

Target audience

Ideal for new entrants to the construction and traffic management industry or anyone who is required to participate in and/or carry out short term low impact work activities on or near the roadway or in proximity to traffic.

Prerequisites

NIL. Previous knowledge and experience in risk management and risk assessment would be an advantage to complete this program.

This eLearning program engages learners in interactive and practical interactions. The benefits of undertaking this program for employers, employees and individuals include:

Duration

4. build confidence in workers to speak up if they believe their or other's safety may be compromised.
