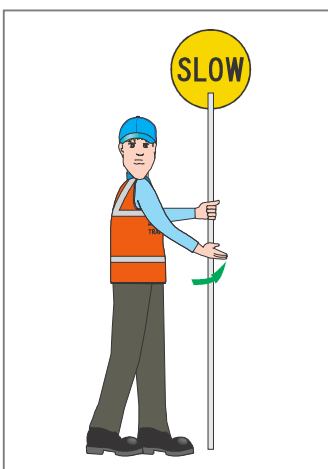

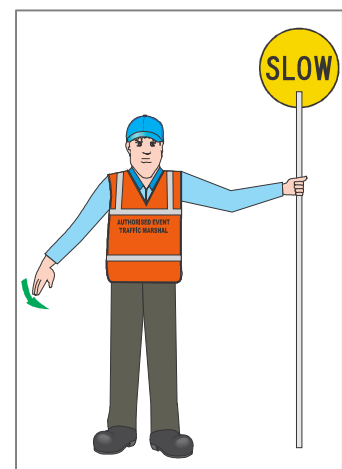
Which image shows the TO GO control signal? (Please circle your answer)

### Question 15

Does the procedure outlined below correctly describe what is required to release STOPPED traffic? (Please circle your answer)

- Wait until the event that has required traffic to be stopped has finished (either by visual check or verbal confirmation from another Event Traffic Marshal or an accredited Traffic Controller)
- Move to a safe position off the travelled path, that is clear of all traffic
- Perform a second check to confirm that traffic is no longer required to be stopped
- Turn and stand in a sideways position so all traffic can be visually monitored, then turn the bat so that the SLOW sign is facing the stopped traffic.
- With your free hand, give the GO signal to drivers
