Electrical upgrade works to begin on Nerang-Broadbeach Road and Sunshine Boulevard intersection

- Essential upgrade works are set to commence this month at the intersection of Nerang-Broadbeach Road (Hooker Boulevard) and Sunshine Boulevard in Broadbeach.
- The project will upgrade the traffic signals and road lighting to improve reliability and reduce maintenance needs.
- Pedestrian kerb ramps will also be reconstructed as part of the works.

One of Broadbeach's busiest intersections, adjacent to Pacific Fair Shopping Centre and the Broadbeach Library, is set to undergo major upgrade works.

The project will ensure the safe and reliable operation of the intersection is maintained by upgrading the existing traffic signals, road lighting and underground cabling. The pedestrian kerb ramps will also be reconstructed as part of the works.

The single-lane overpass from Hooker Boulevard into Sunshine Boulevard will remain operational throughout the works.

The Queensland Government has awarded the contract for these works to Bellwether Group.

During the construction period, changed traffic conditions will apply, including temporary lane closures, stop/slow control measures, and reduced speed limits. Motorists are encouraged to take care when travelling through the intersection.

Work is due to commence this month (October 2025) and is expected to take approximately three months to complete, subject to weather conditions, contractor availability and site conditions.

A total of \$2.1 million has been allocated to this upgrade, which will significantly improve reliability and reduce ongoing maintenance costs.

Vincent Doran, General Manager, Statewide Network Operations said the upgrade will improve safety for those who use this intersection every day.

"These works are vital to ensure the ongoing smooth operation of the Nerang-Broadbeach (Hooker Boulevard) Road and Sunshine Boulevard intersection. This is a great opportunity to upgrade one of the areas busiest intersections with newer, more reliable equipment," the Mr Doran said.

"The upgrade will maintain safety for pedestrians and motorists who use this intersection every day, as well as improving traffic functionality.
