Pedestrian safety upgrades now complete in Warwick

- Queensland Government has completed safety upgrades for students and the local Warwick community.
- Eight ‘wombat crossings’ have been constructed.
- The pedestrian crossings have been installed on Warwick–Allora Road (Victoria Street) at the Palmerin and Guy streets roundabouts at Warwick State High School.

The Queensland Government has improved safety for pedestrians on Warwick–Allora Road, locally known as Victoria Street, at Warwick State High School.

Eight raised pedestrian crossings, nicknamed wombat crossings, have been constructed at the Victoria Street and Palmerin and Guy streets roundabouts.

The raised crossings encourage traffic to slow down and improve visibility, safety and accessibility for people crossing the road.

The installation of the wombat crossings, complete the safety project after a mid-block pedestrian crossing was installed on Victoria Street in 2024 as part of the Queensland Government’s School Transport Infrastructure Program (STIP).

The STIP delivers minor infrastructure projects to improve road safety at schools for their communities.

The pedestrian safety upgrade works were completed in September 2025.
