Safety improvements completed for Strathpine-Samford Road Route Safety Project

- Signalised intersection now operational at Eatons Crossing Road and Lilley Road in Cashmere.
- Wide centre line treatment and shoulder widening improve safety for all road users, including bike riders.
- New turning lanes and police enforcement bay will improve traffic flow and support road safety initiatives.

Motorists travelling through Cashmere can expect safer conditions following the completion of the Strathpine-Samford Road Route Safety Project.

Delivered under the Department of Transport and Main Roads' (TMR) Targeted Road Safety Program, the project focused on delivering a safe and secure transport network by reducing transport-related fatalities and serious injuries through capital infrastructure improvements to roads and adjacent roadsides.

Key safety improvements include a wide centre line treatment to increase separation between vehicles travelling in opposite directions, shoulder widening to provide additional space for vehicles to pull over, assist emergency vehicles, accommodate wide vehicles, and improve safety for bike riders, dedicated right- and left-turn lanes at multiple locations as well as new police enforcement bays.

Transport and Main Roads Acting Regional Director (North Coast) Mel Dei Rossi said these safety improvements reflect the Queensland Government's commitment to improving road safety and responding to community needs.

"The completion of these upgrades marks a significant step forward in improving safety along this busy corridor. From the signalised intersection to widened shoulders and dedicated turning lanes, each element has been carefully designed to reduce risk and improve traffic flow," Ms Dei Rossi said.

"Road users are reminded to take extra care when navigating the upgraded sections of Eatons Crossing Road, particularly while adjusting to new traffic signals and lane configurations.

"This project is a clear example of how TMR's Targeted Road Safety Program is delivering real, measurable improvements to Queensland's transport network."

While major construction is complete, minor finalisation works may still occur to meet safety and compliance standards. These improvements are part of TMR's ongoing



commitment to delivering an accessible, reliable, and most importantly, safe road network across Queensland.
