Safety works on the Cunningham Highway completed

- The Queensland Government's Department of Transport and Main Roads has completed safety upgrades on the Cunningham Highway between Warwick and Inglewood.
- Key Improvements include road widening, removal of roadside hazards, intersection upgrades and double barrier line marking
- These upgrades aim to significantly reduce the risk of fatal and serious injury crashes.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads has upgraded infrastructure to improve safety on the Cunningham Highway between Lyndhurst Lane, Warwick and the Millmerran–Inglewood Road intersection, Inglewood.

Works along the 100-kilometre section of the highway commenced in May 2025 and were completed in November 2025.

Improvements to the Cunningham Highway between Warwick and Inglewood include:

- road widening
- roadside hazard removal
- intersection upgrades
- installation of double barrier line marking

This project was delivered by the Queensland Government under the Targeted Road Safety Program.

Transport and Main Roads Regional Director (Southern Queensland), Bill Lansbury said the safety improvements on the Cunningham Highway aimed to reduce crashes.

“Improvements have included road widening, removal of roadside hazards, intersection upgrades and installation of double barrier line marking,” Mr Lansbury said.

“We would like to thank the community for their patience as we carried out these safety improvements.”
