Repair works to commence at Yabby Street (One Mile) Jetty, North Stradbroke Island

Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ) is carrying out repair works on the Yabby Street Jetty at One Mile, North Stradbroke Island, to maintain the facility in good working order for the island's boating and fishing community.

These important works will ensure the jetty remains fit for purpose and is safe for all users for years to come.

Works are being carried out by South-East Queensland based specialist contractor Mitchell Marine Constructions Pty Ltd.

Construction is set to begin the week of 14 July 2025 and is expected to run for six weeks, weather permitting.

The scope of works includes repairs to the concrete elements including the decking soffit and surface; repairs to the stairwell landings; piling works and minor works to the fencing.

The existing berthing pontoon system that was damaged during Tropical Cyclone Alfred will also be repaired as part of the works.

In the best interests of public safety and efficiency for the contractor, the jetty will be closed for public access during construction.

Recreational boating access in the area is maintained by the adjacent One Mile Pontoon, which has a dedicated area for use by recreational boaties on the northern end platform – keeping in mind this facility is also utilised by the One Mile ferry service who have a dedicated platform on the western side.

Please use extra caution around the worksite both on the landside and in-water.

MSQ would like to thank the community for their patience and understanding while these works are underway.
