A safer town centre one step closer for Pomona

- A project to improve pedestrian safety in Pomona has reached a key milestone.
- The project responds to years of strong community advocacy for safer streets in the town centre.
- Construction will be delivered in two stages with stage 1 commencing later this year, weather and scheduling permitting
- Improvements include new pedestrian crossings, raised township entry road treatments and a reduced 40km/h speed limit.

The Queensland Government is improving pedestrian safety in Pomona with the detailed design stage for Factory Street improvements now complete.

The remaining town centre design is also nearing finalisation, delivering practical changes to help slow traffic, improve pedestrian safety and protect Pomona's village character.

Throughout the design process, the Queensland Government has worked closely with Noosa Shire Council to ensure the project aligns with the Pomona Place Plan and reflects strong community feedback on walkability, safety and town character.

Construction will be delivered in two stages, with Stage 1 (Factory Street) expected to commence in late 2026, weather and scheduling permitting, and Stage 2 (town centre) to follow.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads North Coast Regional Director Melanie Dei Rossi said the project reflected the department's commitment to delivering for communities

"We've worked closely with Noosa Shire Council and the local community to understand the issues in Pomona and identify practical ways to improve safety," Ms Dei Rossi said.

"These improvements will help slow traffic and make the town centre safer and more welcoming."
