Brisbane–Beenleigh Road safety upgrades begin at eight locations

- Construction will begin this month on a series of safety upgrades along Brisbane–Beenleigh Road.
- Upgrades at eight priority sites will improve safety for motorists and pedestrians in Logan.
- Works include intersection upgrades, pedestrian safety improvements, new U-turn facilities and safety barriers.

The Queensland Government is improving safety for thousands of road users with targeted upgrades at eight locations along Brisbane–Beenleigh Road.

As part of the Queensland Government's Targeted Road Safety Program, upgrades will be rolled out between Underwood and Beenleigh to reduce crashes and improve safety for motorists, pedestrians and other road users.

The project will deliver a range of targeted safety treatments at the eight locations including intersection upgrades, pedestrian safety improvements, new and extended U-turn facilities and new safety barriers.

Brisbane–Beenleigh Road has been identified as a high-risk corridor due to the frequency and severity of crashes.

The series of works will include a new signalised pedestrian crossing and line marking at the Logan Road–Kingston Road intersection, and an extended U-turn facility and advanced directional signage south of the Station Road–Kingston Road intersection.

Works will also include new guardrail and vegetation clearing on the northbound side of Kingston Road at Monash Road and upgraded pedestrian facilities across the driveway of the rural business at Logan River Road–Harburg Drive, Beenleigh.

Construction of the improvements are planned to begin in August 2026.

Department of Transport and Main Roads Acting Regional Director (South Coast) Belinda Stewart said the targeted upgrades would help reduce crashes and improve safety for all road users.

"Brisbane–Beenleigh Road is a key transport corridor for Logan, and these upgrades will help make it safer and more reliable for the community," Ms Stewart said.

"The Queensland Government is investing in important safety improvements where they are needed most.

"The Queensland Government's Targeted Road Safety Program focuses on delivering targeted upgrades that make a real difference to safety outcomes for Queensland communities."

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
