## **Community welcomed to have say on Dunwich Ferry Terminal Upgrade design**

- Concept design released for the Dunwich Ferry Terminal Upgrade.
- Locals can have their say during community consultation until 21 June.
- The concept design features improved functionality, accessibility and the customer experience at the terminal.

The Queensland Government has released a concept design for the Dunwich Ferry Terminal Upgrade on North Stradbroke Island.

The concept design proposes upgrades that improve the use and experience of the ferry terminal while integrating with the island's character and culture.

Key features include a new dual-berth passenger pontoon, pedestrian shelters, improved parking and bus facilities and landscaped community open spaces.

Planning for the upgrade has been funded by the South East Queensland (SEQ) City Deal, and informed by the Gumpi Master Plan and input from key stakeholders.

The local community and island visitors are now encouraged to provide feedback on the concept by attending an information session or completing an online survey by 21 June 2026.

The Dunwich Ferry Terminal Upgrade is a \$41 million commitment funded through the SEQ City Deal, which will provide long-lasting benefits to the region.

The upgrade is being funded by the Australian Government, the Queensland Government and Redland City Council.

Acting Deputy Director-General Network Services and Operations Dean Helm said the ferry terminal was a significant community landmark and an important transport gateway for the region.

“This key milestone presents an opportunity to understand local needs and reflect on potential priorities for the ferry terminal upgrade,” Mr Helm said.

“We’re making sure that any upgrades to the terminal have a focus on enhancing island connectivity, tourism, and the experience of our customers.

“Following community consultation, the project will undertake further planning to inform the project design and delivery phases.

“I encourage residents to have their say on this essential infrastructure upgrade and help shape how it will benefit and reflect North Stradbroke Island’s unique assets and its community.”

The Redland City Council also urged local residents to attend an information session and complete the survey, as the community had a valued role to play in shaping and informing the upgrade.
