Contract awarded for Kurrimine boat ramp

- The Queensland Government will deliver a major upgrade to the Kurrimine Beach boat ramp.
- Designed in consultation with local ramp users, the upgraded facility will greatly improve vessel access to and from the area's popular waters.
- The contract has been awarded and works are expected to start after the wet season in 2026.

The Queensland Government has awarded a contract for construction of a highly anticipated upgrade to the boat ramp at Kurrimine Beach.

The project will be delivered by Australian Marine & Civil Pty Ltd, which has a strong background of delivering quality marine infrastructure across the state.

Construction is expected to start in early May 2026 and will be completed in time for the September school holidays, weather permitting.

The project includes a new two-lane piled boat ramp, a fixed walkway with handrails and fenders, improved tidal access by extending the ramp, design features to allow natural sand movement, reducing the need for costly beach nourishment, and new emergency beach access ramps.

These improvements will reduce maintenance needs and greatly improve the ramp's safety and access for recreational and commercial marine users.

Weather permitting, construction will be completed in time for the annual Kurrimine Beach Fishing & Spearfishing Classic.

During construction, Maritime Safety Queensland will provide a temporary boat-launching facility immediately south of the existing ramp.

This will help to maintain marine access for local trailer boat users while the new ramp is being built.
