Plan ahead for Riverfire travel with Translink

- Extra public transport services will operate before and after Riverfire to help customers travel to the event precinct and return home.
- Customers can travel to Riverfire for just 50 cents and enjoy free travel home from selected locations after the fireworks.
- Patrons are encouraged to plan their trip in advance by visiting the [Translink website](#), using the Translink app, or calling 13 12 30.

Riverfire is expected to draw large crowds to Brisbane on Saturday, with extra bus and train services scheduled to help customers travel to and from the event.

The event program kicks off from 4pm, before the fireworks display lights up the Brisbane River from 7pm. Getting to Riverfire is simple and affordable, with 50 cent fares in place across the Translink network, excluding Airtrain.

There will be free travel from selected busway and train stations between 7.30pm and 9.30pm making it easier for festivalgoers to leave the city after the fireworks.

More public transport services will be available this year, with 80 extra train services operating across the network, including 38 services before the event and 42 services afterwards.

From the end of the fireworks until 9pm, most buses leaving Brisbane City will bypass the Cultural Centre, South Bank and Mater Hill busway stations, with frequent M1, M2, 555 and shuttle services helping customers connect with their usual routes.

Extra buses will also operate from Cultural Centre, South Bank and inner-city bus stations in the evening, after the fireworks from South Bank terminal.

Due to protected industrial action by Maritime Union of Australia Division of the CFMEU (the MUA), Brisbane River ferry services will not be operating on Saturday, so customers are encouraged to visit the Translink website to plan their journey using an alternate mode of transport.

For customers travelling from Logan, a special Riverfire shuttle, route RF5, will run from Loganholme to South Bank before the fireworks, stopping at Loganholme station, Slacks Creek park 'n' ride, Springwood station and Rochedale station before travelling express to South Bank station.

Shuttles will run every 30 minutes from 3.05pm until 5.35pm, making it easier to leave the car at home and enjoy the night.

Additional customer service staff will also be deployed across key busway stations to help customers with travel information and journey planning following the event.

Head of Translink Dean Helm said public transport remained the easiest way for customers to travel to and from Riverfire.

“Riverfire attracts large crowds into Brisbane each year and we encourage customers to plan ahead, travel early and allow extra time when making their journey,” Mr Helm said.

“With extra bus services operating, and free travel available from selected busway and train stations after the fireworks, public transport is a convenient and affordable way to get to and from the event.”

Customers are encouraged to plan their journey before travelling and allow extra time as crowds leave the event precinct and are reminded to tap on using a valid go card, contactless debit or credit card, or travel with a paper ticket.

Fast facts:

- Extra high-frequency bus services will operate before and after Riverfire on routes M1, 61, 100, 120, 130, 140, 150, 180, 200, 220, 222, 330, 333, 345, 385, 444 and 555.
- Route M1 services will operate every four minutes from approximately 3pm.
- Route 444 services will operate every seven to eight minutes from approximately 3pm.
- Route 555 services will operate every 15 minutes from approximately 3pm.
- Route 222 and route 333 services will operate every eight minutes from approximately 5pm.

- The special Riverfire shuttle (RF5) will operate every 30 minutes before the fireworks between Loganholme and South Bank, stopping at Loganholme, Slacks Creek park 'n' ride, Springwood, South Bank and Cultural Centre stations.
- Following the fireworks, RF5 shuttle services towards Loganholme will operate every five to 10 minutes between 7.30pm and 8.15pm.
- High-frequency M1, M2, 555 and dedicated shuttle services will operate from Cultural Centre, South Bank and Mater Hill stations after the fireworks to help customers connect with their usual routes.
- Train services will operate at approximately 15-minute intervals between 7.35pm and 9.05pm on all lines except Airport, Doomben, Rosewood and Sunshine Coast.
- Free travel will be available between 7.30pm and 9.30pm from selected busway and train stations following the fireworks.
- Normal Translink fares, including 50 cent fares, will apply when travelling to Riverfire.

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
