Whyte Island boat ramp upgrade starting this month

- The Queensland Government is upgrading Whyte Island boat ramp to improve safety, functionality and access for the boating community.
- Works will start in late April, with boaties encouraged to use alternative ramps during construction.

The Queensland Government's upgrade of the Whyte Island boat ramp will soon get underway, delivering a safer, more modern facility for Brisbane's bayside boating community.

The project includes reconstruction of the existing ramp, replacement of the floating walkway and installation of new piles to improve resilience and usability.

Once complete, the upgraded ramp will enhance marine safety, support recreational boating and help meet community expectations and local industry needs, while also contributing to broader tourism and economic activity across the region.

Works are expected to take approximately around 12 weeks, with completion planned for late July 2026, weather and site conditions permitting.

For public safety and to support efficient construction, the Whyte Island boat ramp will be fully closed for the duration of the upgrade.

Boaters are encouraged to use alternative nearby launch facilities, including:

- Glenora Street boat ramp, Wynnum – approximately 8km south of Whyte Island.
- Manly boat harbour (north and south ramps) – approximately 11km south of Whyte Island.
- Colmslie boat ramp – approximately 13km south-west of Whyte Island.
- Aquarium Avenue boat ramp, Hemmant – approximately 7.6km south-west of Whyte Island (council owned facility).

The Queensland Government thanks the community for its patience and cooperation and looks forward to delivering improved marine infrastructure for Brisbane's bayside boating community.
