Safer speeds for Kalbar and Warrill View

Speed limits have been reduced through the rural towns of Kalbar and Warrill View after recommendations by the local Speed Management Committee.

Transport and Main Roads (TMR) South Coast Regional Director Paul Noonan said a speed limit review had been completed and endorsed by the committee.

"A range of factors such as crash history, prevailing traffic speeds, road function and roadside environment were considered in the review," Mr Noonan said.

"The speed limit has been permanently reduced to 50km/h on George Street, Kalbar, from north of the Edward Street intersection to around 170 metres south of Davies Street.

"In Warrill View, the limit along the Cunningham Highway has dropped to 60km/h from around 850 metres north of Rosewood Warrill View Road intersection, near Warrill View State School, to around 200 metres south of the Warrill View Peak Crossing Road intersection."

Mr Noonan said the local Speed Management Committee included representatives from the Queensland Police Service, Scenic Rim Council and TMR.

"Speed limits are in place to improve safety for all road users," he said.

"I urge all motorists to observe the new speed limits and always drive to the conditions."
