Member for Kawana, Jarrod Bleijie, has slammed the Palaszczuk Government for scrapping vital road infrastructure projects to support the delivery of the Sunshine Coast Public University Hospital ("SCPUH").

Due to open in 2016, Mr Bleijie said the existing road network around the SCPUH remains completely inadequate and will not cope with the increased capacity.

"What we now have is a \$1.8B health precinct without any proposed upgrade to the existing road infrastructure. This is simply unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by Anastacia Palaszczuk."

Mr Bleijie said when in Government, the LNP proposed \$400M worth of road projects to ease congestion and plan for the future. This included the Mooloolah River Interchange project which was finalised this year by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.

"One of the first acts of the Palaszczuk Government was to immediately axe this project and both the Premier and her Minister have failed to provide an alternate plan."

Mr Bleijie said that up to 50 homes have already been resumed and the planning stage completed for the project.

“Annastacia Palaszczuk and her Ministers are shutting down important infrastructure projects all around the state, with no foresight or regard to what this means for local jobs and the economy.

“This project would have been a catalyst for job creation on the Coast as well delivering upon the critical road infrastructure we need to support the continued growth of the region.”

The Mooloolah River Interchange project includes a new direct connection to the \$1.8B SCPUH via a new two lane arterial road and would better connect Caloundra, Kawana, Mooloolaba and Maroochydore, acting to reduce congestion on Nicklin Way.

“Without an upgrade to the existing road network we will see hugely increased congestion on Nicklin Way, Kawana Way and the Sunshine Motorway.

“Buses, paramedics, doctors, nurses, hospital staff, patients, local residents and general motorists will all be sharing the same, single lane, road space to access the Hospital.

Mr Bleijie is concerned that the Labor Government’s approach of “do-nothing” will mean patients and motorists may be forced to endure months of road works after the SCPUH has opened its doors to the public.

“We can’t be in a position where once the Hospital opens, our roads are overwhelmed, and the Government is forced to react.

“That would mean months and months of roadworks after the Hospital opens, with thousands of people trying to access the hospital.

“This Government must act now, to ensure the road infrastructure is completed before the Hospital opens to improve safety, efficiency and road capacity in and around the Kawana Health Precinct.

“It could be the difference between a life saved or lost.”

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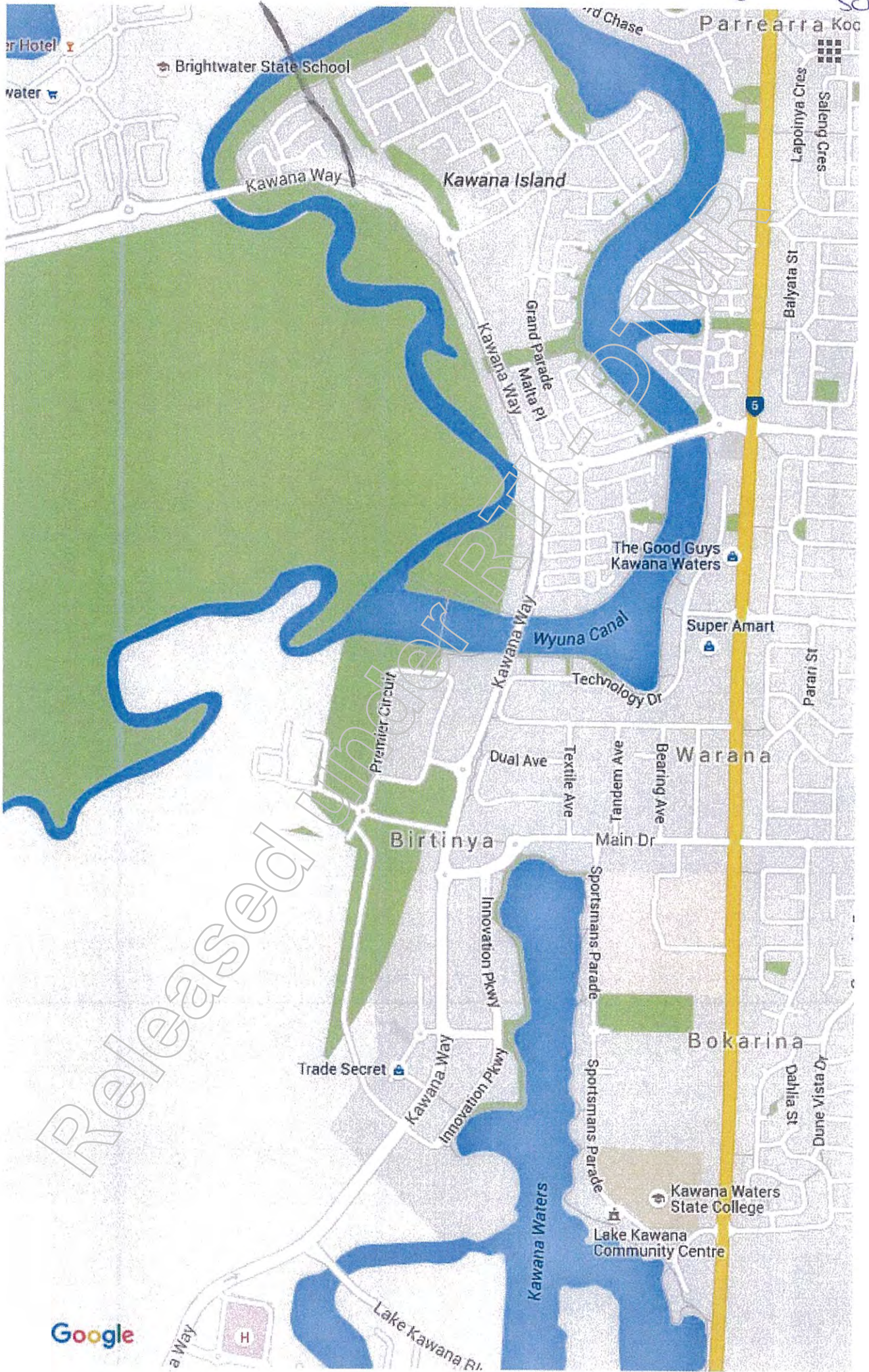

Proposed response for the Sunshine Coast Daily below – Tam's broadly happy with it, she's not keen on the last line though:

Response:

It's disappointing that Sunshine Coast LNP Members continue to suggest that this project had been allocated funding by the previous LNP Government – it hadn't. It was completely unfunded, and wholly dependent on asset sales, a proposal rejected by both the Labor Party, and the Queensland people.

In fact, the Member for Kawana admitted the facts in his media release yesterday, describing the project as "proposed".

The LNP had three years to deliver, and they didn't.

Unfortunately, as well as spending \$30 million of the Transport and Main Roads budget on preparing for asset sales and contestability the previous Government cut \$600 million from transport funding over the last three years, which has had obvious impacts on road construction right across the State.

I can confirm for the local community that the Department of Transport and Main Roads is finalising the planning phase for the Mooloolah River Interchange (MRI) project, including improving connections to the new Sunshine Coast University Hospital.

The recommended option includes an upgrade of the Mooloolah River interchange, a land-based road crossing over the Mooloolah River to Kawana Way, and duplication of the Sunshine Motorway between Kawana Way and the interchange.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) work closely with Queensland Health. This project aims to provide a solution to the growing Sunshine Coast congestion issues and future road network access to the Sunshine Coast University Hospital.

His claim that the LNP had committed \$440 million while in government for the Mooloolah River Interchange upgrade is not factual and is not supported by any budget or bone fide Treasury document his government produced while in power.

The truth is his LNP belatedly promised it after three years of inaction while in power if re-elected based on asset sales which they have since abandoned.

Therefore to claim the funding was withdrawn is deliberately misleading Sunshine Coast residents with political spin in a desperate bid to cover up Mr Bleijie's dithering local record despite a record majority at the time.

"Without these upgrades to the Sunshine Coast road network, motorists will continue to experience crippling congestion along Nicklin Way, Kawana Way and the Sunshine Motorway."

Buderim MP Steve Dickson said it's hard to fathom why Labor hasn't prioritised the business case for the MRI upgrade, which would improve safety for motorists and provide better access to one of the state's largest new hospitals.

"The Premier has admitted that the timing and construction is subject to competing priorities and available funding, but if a commitment isn't made soon it's unlikely it will be delivered in time," Mr Dickson said.

Member for Caloundra Mark McArdle added that further delays to the Sunshine Coast University Hospital were delivering a huge blow to local businesses, who are already struggling to survive because of continual delays.

“Many operators who were anticipating a November opening are now scrambling to make up the short-fall, which will undoubtedly have a major impact on our local economy,” Mr McArdle said.

We are undertaking several planning projects to meet forecasted transport needs of the rapidly-growing southern Sunshine Coast area.

We are also focused on delivering a program of works to provide immediate, cost-effective improvements to local transport infrastructure to benefit motorists, until future upgrades can be delivered.

Mooloolah River Interchange – Kawana Arterial and Sunshine Motorway Upgrade

Planning has been undertaken for the Mooloolah River interchange – Kawana Arterial and Sunshine Motorway upgrade (MRI project). This supersedes previous planning carried out for a key segment of the Multi-Modal Transport Corridor.

A preliminary business case has been completed for the MRI project. Funding for design and delivery is currently being considered against competing infrastructure priorities.

Once further planning is completed, more details regarding construction timeframes can be determined.

The \$435 million upgrade includes a new connection to the \$1.8 billion Sunshine Coast University Hospital precinct via a new two-lane road, which will form an early stage of the future Kawana Arterial. This will connect Kawana Way at Parrearra across the Mooloolah River with an upgraded Mooloolah River Interchange on the Sunshine Motorway at Mountain Creek.

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Planning is also underway into longer-term stages of the proposed Kawana Arterial. This will ultimately provide a new high-speed north-south connection, to the west of Kawana Way, connecting the upgraded MRI with Kawana Way Connection Road at Woodlands Boulevard.

These planned transport improvements will provide critical transport capacity to support the new Sunshine Coast University Hospital, the emerging Kawana health precinct, and the future Kawana Town Centre. They will also better connect commuters travelling between Caloundra, Kawana, Mooloolaba and Maroochydore, and help to reduce congestion on Nicklin Way.

In the meantime, the Queensland Government is delivering a \$22 million program of works to provide immediate access improvements to the Sunshine Coast University Hospital. Works are underway to improve capacity at four roundabouts along Kawana Way, and to improve capacity at Kawana Way Link Road between Woodlands Boulevard and the Creekside Boulevard intersection with Kawana Way. Similarly, Infrastructure Australia (IA) provide advice to the Australian Government in regard to major infrastructure investment. IA evaluate infrastructure proposals where funding of more than \$100 million is sought from Australian Government. This includes economic and social infrastructure proposals but excludes defence proposals.

Mooloolah River Interchange – Kawana Arterial and Sunshine Motorway Upgrade

Planning has been undertaken for the Mooloolah River interchange – Kawana Arterial and Sunshine Motorway upgrade (MRI project). This supersedes previous planning carried out for a key segment of the Multi-Modal Transport Corridor.

A preliminary business case has been completed for the MRI project. Funding for design and delivery is currently being considered against competing infrastructure priorities.

Once further planning is completed, more details regarding construction timeframes can be determined.

The \$435 million upgrade includes a new connection to the \$1.8 billion Sunshine Coast University Hospital precinct via a new two-lane road, which will form an early stage of the future Kawana Arterial. This will connect Kawana Way at Parrearra across the Mooloolah River with an upgraded Mooloolah River Interchange on the Sunshine Motorway at Mountain Creek.

The planning also provides a new direct connection for northbound traffic from Nicklin Way to Brisbane Road, and upgrades the east-west section of the Sunshine Motorway from two to four lanes between the MRI and Kawana Way interchange.

Mooloolah River Interchange – Kawana Arterial and Sunshine Motorway Upgrade

Planning is also underway into longer-term stages of the proposed Kawana Arterial. This will ultimately provide a new high-speed north-south connection, to the west of Kawana Way, connecting the upgraded MRI with Kawana Way Connection Road at Woodlands Boulevard.

These planned transport improvements will provide critical transport capacity to support the new Sunshine Coast University Hospital, the emerging Kawana health precinct, and the future Kawana Town Centre. They will also better connect commuters travelling between Caloundra, Kawana, Mooloolaba and Maroochydore, and help to reduce congestion on Nicklin Way.

In the meantime, the Queensland Government is delivering a \$22 million program of works to provide immediate access improvements to the Sunshine Coast University Hospital. Works are underway to improve capacity at four roundabouts along Kawana Way, and to improve capacity at Kawana Way Link Road between Woodlands Boulevard and the Creekside Boulevard intersection with Kawana Way. <image002.jpg>JAMMED UP: A recent Kawana Way traffic jam at about 8.30am. Huw Williams HE COULD throw a stone and hit the Sunshine Coast's new hospital from his office, but Fisher MP Andrew Wallace will be doing all he can to avoid driving near the new facility come April.

He says Kawana Way would "cripple" access to the hospital and would affect access to the University of the Sunshine Coast, lamenting the failure of State Governments to deliver the \$430 million Mooloolah River Interchange in time for the hospital's April opening.

"We are going to hate driving around this area because it's just going to be a huge bottleneck," Mr Wallace said.

He said it was already "bumper to bumper" and with an extra 6000 people using the roads it would prove a nightmare to navigate quickly.

He praised both sides of state politics for delivering the \$1.8 billion hospital, which he said would be great for local businesses and future patients.

But the insufficient road network would remain an issue, the recent widening of roads around Kawana Way roundabouts not enough to solve the problem, he argued.

The former Newman government said it would fund the project under its failed Strong Choices election platform.

Current Main Roads Minister Mark Bailey has said previously the project had never been fully planned for or costed by the LNP during its three years in power.

He said the Palaszczuk government had inherited problems with the project and were working to deliver a range of traffic solutions around the new hospital, which include a recent \$22 million upgrade of Kawana Way roundabouts to widen lanes and improve traffic flow.

Priority traffic signals for emergency vehicles have also been installed around the health precinct to enable faster ambulance access from Nicklin Way.

According to the Building Queensland website, the Mooloolah River Interchange building case has been through preliminary evaluation, but was yet to be completed, awaiting State Government consideration.

Of concern for Buderim MP Steve Dickson was the 18 month to two-year process for pre-filling of the site that has to happen before the Interchange could be built.

That time is needed to allow soil to compact before bitumen is laid over the fill.

Meanwhile Mr Wallace also touched on the issue of rail duplication on the Sunshine Coast, criticising the State Government for failing to make some "hard economic decisions".

He said it was reaching a stage where the Federal Government may have to step in and take action to deliver the Beerburrum-Nambour rail upgrade.

"If the State Government is unable or unwilling to provide that infrastructure than the Federal Government has to start having some discussions about how it can get involved, ala, the train duplication," Mr Wallace said.

"It's not our responsibility, but if we are able to have a part to play in that rail duplication then that will take pressure off the Bruce Hwy. That will lead to less accidents, that will lead to better economic drivers, because people aren't stuck in a car for three hours going down to Brisbane there and three hours going home.

"It's a real problem (rail duplication) because it's almost rewarding poor behaviour (if the Federal Government stepped in).

"If you take it down to a parent and child sort of situation where the child cracks the wobbles and you give the kid a Mars Bar to shut him up."

In September Mr Bailey told a group of Coast residents a business case was being prepared for the Beerburrum-Nambour project to justify rail duplication, in order to guide future funding.

Building Queensland's website has flagged the cost of delivery of the project to be between \$600 million to \$700 million, with an estimate to be provided once the business case is complete, with a number of options still being considered.

The Daily has sent questions to Mr Bailey's office and Building Queensland for an update on exactly where the Mooloolah River Interchange business case process is up to and we'll update the story once they have responded.

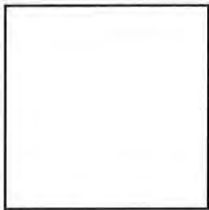

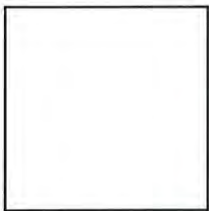
