Data was extracted on 12 November 2025 and is subject to change

Road Use Intelligence (RUI) allows a three month lag for extracting and providing offence data. This allows for completeness of data and time for the offence notice to be entered into Transport Registration And Integrated Licensing System (TRAILS). The three month lag includes the 28 day period for the alleged offender to pay or respond to the offence notice. Some offence categories will still be understated due to the prolonged time it takes for these matters to be finalised (e.g. Drink Driving offences, Camera detected offences).

The 'total face value' for infringement notices issued is calculated by using the current fine/penalty amount (as at 31 October 2025) multiplied by the number of infringement notices issued. This is not the amount received by Transport and Main Roads (TMR) as TMR does not receive all payments for infringement notices issued, therefore Road Use Intelligence (RUI) is unable to provide data on revenue collected.

Camera detected infringement notices issued to registered corporate entities incur a penalty amount five times greater than a penalty enforced on an individual. As speed and red light offences are recognised as life endangering and are a major cause of crashes, corporate entities are encouraged to nominate the person in charge / driver of the vehicle at the time of offence.
