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1 Policy Statement

Where a transport infrastructure project is funded by the Queensland Government through the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme (TIDS), public recognition for that project will be mutually agreed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) and local government and will acknowledge all parties that have contributed.

2 Applicability

This policy applies to transport infrastructure projects that have a TIDS funding contribution.

3 Objectives

The purpose of this policy is to ensure appropriate public recognition of TIDS funded projects acknowledges the contribution of both the State and local governments.

4 Rationale

Local governments are required to acknowledge Queensland Government funding in all materials developed for TIDS funded projects.

TIDS was created under the *Transport Infrastructure Act (Roads) 1994* provision for road funds to be spent off the state-controlled road network. The majority of TIDS funding is provided on a matched funding basis; that is, jointly funded projects by state and local governments.

5 Conditions

Recognition	Conditions	
Media and Events	All formal public statements, media releases or statements, displays, publications and advertising relating to a jointly funded project and generated by a local government, must acknowledge the funding contribution by the Queensland Government.	
	Any project-related materials that refer to a TIDS funded project are to be reviewed at officer level by an appropriate TMR district representative prior to release (see attached Guidelines).	
Signage	Project signs must be erected by local government for all projects for which TIDS funding of \$250,000 or more contributes to total project cost.	
	Signs must be in the form specified in the attached Guidelines to ensure state-wide consistency.

Recognition Guidelines 2021

These Guidelines are an attachment to the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme Project Recognition Policy 2021

General Guidelines

Media and Events

All formal public statements, media releases or statements, displays, publications, advertising and social media relating to a Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme (TIDS) funded project and generated by a local government, must include one of the following acknowledgements, as appropriate:

- "Proudly funded by the Queensland Government through the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme, and <council name>."
- "Proudly funded by the Queensland Government through the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme."

When there is more than one local government contributor, the acknowledgement must include the Queensland Government first and then name each local government contributor.

Where any media and/or events are proposed, the local government and an appropriate representative from the TMR district will work cooperatively in arranging matters to ensure:

- both parties have adequate notice of the proposed media and/or event, particularly where it is a ceremony and dates, plaques and attendance by Members of Parliament are to be arranged
- the TMR district is provided with an appropriate opportunity to review the proposed media and/or event arrangements.

Signage

The local government must ensure that signs are erected for all projects for which TIDS funding of \$250,000 or more contributes to total project cost.

- The cost of sign supply, erection and removal will be allocated to the project.
- A minimum of two (2) signs must be erected at the project site.
- All signs must be erected in a prominent but safe position facing oncoming traffic so that they are plainly visible to passing motorists.
- Signs will be erected two weeks before a project commences and removed no later than 12 months following project completion.
- A photograph of each sign erected for a project must be provided to the TMR district office and emailed to <u>roads.alliance.communications@tmr.qld.gov.au</u> as part of the project completion process.



Sign Design Options

Design options (attached) include:

- TC1842_1 existing design that can be used for one-line project names
- TC1842_2 existing design that can be used for two-line project names
- TC1842_3 new primary sign which must be used together with TC1842_4
- TC1842_4 new sign to include project details that must be used to support the primary sign (TC1842_3) and attached to the same post

Note: TC1842_1 and TC1842_2 can be used under a transitional arrangement until 1 July 2022.

Signs are to be manufactured to MRTS14.

- Changes to sign dimensions, fonts or colours are not permitted.
- Artwork to include contributing local government logos and can include logos' specific fonts and colours.
- Each design option can include one or more local government logos as needed.
