

Mount Lindesay Highway Upgrade

Stoney Camp Road to Chambers Flat Road, Munruben

Start of major construction

March 2021

The Department of Transport and Main Roads is upgrading the Mount Lindesay Highway at Munruben. This \$75 million project is funded by the Australian Government and the Queensland Government under a 50:50 arrangement.

HullSEE JV has been appointed to construct the project, which will begin in March 2021 and continue until late 2022 (weather and site conditions permitting).

Project works will include:

- duplicating the highway from two lanes to four lanes
- safety improvements (including the installation of safety barriers)
- new northbound and southbound bridges over Norris Creek
- improved fauna connectivity and protection.

Site establishment works

Construction works for the project are due to start mid-March 2021. Initial works will include:

- service location works
- preliminary earthworks (including removing topsoil) to prepare the site for construction
- vegetation clearing
- installing temporary project fencing
- geotechnical investigations
- establishing worker facilities including temporary buildings on the Eastern Service Road of the highway
- installation of concrete traffic barriers on the Mount Lindesay Highway to separate work areas from traffic.

What to expect

Once the construction site has been set up, works will continue in stages.

The first stage of works will include:

- construction of the northbound bridge over Norris Creek

- construction of two northbound lanes including earthworks, drainage installation and constructing pavements.

During construction the community can expect:

- reduced speed limits to **60 km/h on Mount Lindesay Highway** and **40 km/h on Stoney Camp on/off ramps and Chambers Flat Road on/off ramps**. These speed limits will be in place for the duration of construction.
- possible light spill from mobile lighting towers used to light the work zones
- an increase in noise, dust and vibration near the work zone
- movement of large construction equipment and machinery
- construction vehicles and machinery which are fitted with flashing lights and reversing beepers for safety reasons
- construction traffic entering and exiting work areas and site offices
- some changes to property access. These will be communicated with residents ahead of any changes being made
- changed traffic conditions including lane closures, reduced speed limits and increased congestion.

Every effort will be made to minimise construction impacts where possible.

Standard work hours and days will be Monday to Saturday, 7am to 5pm. From time to time, work outside of these times may be required for safety reasons or in the case of an emergency.

Nightworks

Nightworks will be required Sunday to Thursday commencing mid-March from 7pm to 5am to safely install traffic barriers, line marking and signage on the Mount Lindesay Highway.

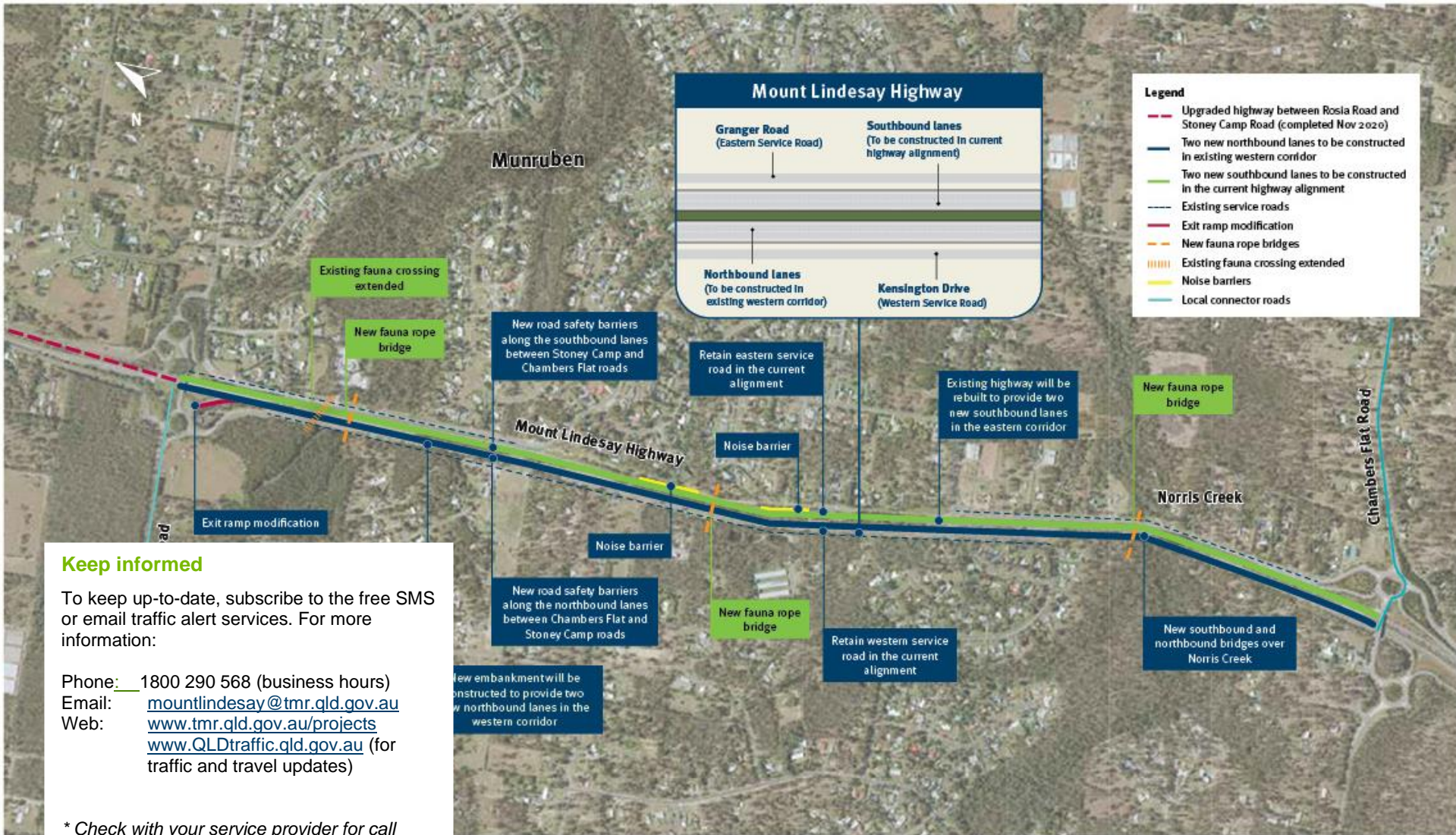


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
