PACIFIC HIGHWAY EARLY WORKS

START OF WORKS NOTIFICATION

SERVICE INVESTIGATION WORKS BETWEEN MOSS STREET AND WESTERWAY STREET

The Pacific Highway early works upgrade is the second package of works being delivered as part of the overarching Pacific Motorway (M1) Eight Mile Plains to Daisy Hill upgrade.

Georgiou Group has been announced as the construction contractor for this upgrade, which will realign and increase the capacity of the Pacific Highway western service road to enable future widening of the M1.

To help inform construction planning, service investigation works will start in **early-July 2020** and take around two weeks to complete, weather and conditions permitting.

These works will be carried out between Monday and Sunday during both day and night hours. This lowimpact work will occur for short periods at each location and progressively move along the project corridor.

Works:

- Investigating local services and cables.
- Non-destructive digging (NDD) will be used to locate and expose underground services and cables.
- NDD uses pressurised water to break up and vacuum soil to expose underground assets and services without damaging them.

Impacts:

- Although this activity is largely low-impact, there will be short periods of high-level noise generated from the NDD.
- Some on-street parking will be occupied for short periods during these investigation works.

NEXT STEPS

Once service investigation works are complete, works will start to relocate public utility services including water mains, telecommunications and storm water drainage along the Pacific Highway western service road.

To enable these works, some general concrete works will be required plus the removal of fences, car parks and vegetation within land resumed to widen the road corridor. Further information will be provided to impacted properties.



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WHAT TO EXPECT DURING THE PROJECT

Car parking changes

All on-road parking along the Pacific Highway western service road between Moss Street and Westerway Street will be permanently removed in stages to enable widening of the M1.

Traffic impacts

For the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers, changed traffic conditions will be required, including reduced speed limits, intermittent lane and footpath changes and altered road configurations.

The speed limit will be reduced to 40km/h during construction hours. Please slow down and obey traffic signage.

Construction impacts

Nearby properties may experience increased noise, dust and vibration. Please note we are committed to undertaking all reasonable and practicable measures to minimise construction impacts.

Construction activities will be staged to help maintain access to businesses. If this is not possible, we will liaise directly with businesses to help manage operational disruptions.

Working hours

Construction activities will generally be undertaken between 7am and 5pm, Monday to Saturday, weather and site conditions permitting.

To help minimise disruption to businesses during operating hours, high-impact works may be undertaken between 6pm and 6am, Sunday to Saturday, and on isolated occasions all day and night (24hrs) on Sundays.
