

# Maryborough–Cooloola Road Reconstruction update – 28 May 2012



Reconstruction works across the length of Maryborough–Cooloola Road will re-start from mid-2012 now the ground conditions have improved. Works will occur between 6 am and 6 pm, Monday to Saturday, weather permitting.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads will make every effort during construction to minimise impacts to motorists and appreciates your patience while these essential works are completed.

The potential time delays to motorists will vary depending on the works being undertaken. To assist you to plan your travels and potentially seek alternative routes, the map provides details of where works are currently occurring and the anticipated delays.

The Maryborough–Cooloola Road reconstruction works are being delivered as part of Operation Queensland.

Operation Queensland is the largest reconstruction effort in Queensland's history and is funded under the joint federal and state government's Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA). Under these arrangements, the Australian Government provides 75% of the funding, with 25% from the Queensland Government.

## All sections

Surveying and maintenance works will continue across all sections with lane closures in place if required.

When lane closures are required, signage, traffic control and a reduced speed limit will be in place. Delays are anticipated to be minimal.

## Sections 33 – 37

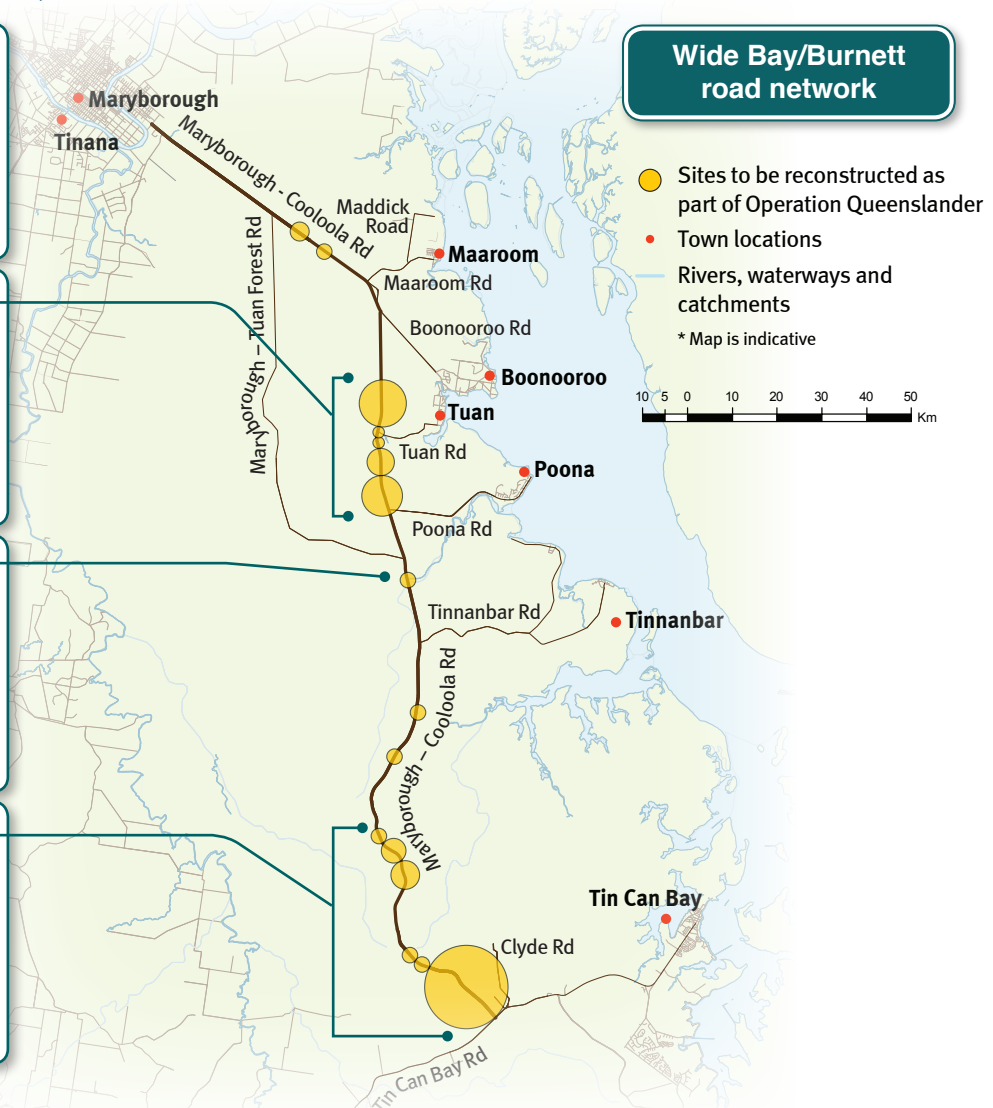
Works will start at the Poona Road intersection and progress north. Works will be under traffic control with a stop-and-go traffic arrangement. Anticipated delays are between three to five minutes. The speed limit during roadworks will be reduced to 40 km/h and restrictions will apply outside of work hours.

## Section 32

Following significant rainfall in early March 2012, part of the road near Poona Creek crossing collapsed. The department is continuing to investigate the most appropriate solution to reconstruct the road. A lane closure, reduced speed limit and traffic signals are in place at all times to assist motorists.

## Sections 21 – 26

Works at the Tin Bay Road intersection will continue and progress north. Works will be under traffic control with a stop-and-go traffic arrangement. Anticipated delays are between three to five minutes. The speed limit during roadworks will be reduced to 40 km/h and restrictions will apply outside of work hours.
