

New T3 Transit and Bus Lanes

Notice to motorists

The driving rules

Driving on two of the Gold Coast's busiest roads has been changed by two major projects that are supporting the expansion of public transport.

- On Smith Street in Southport - the Gold Coast's first T3 Transit Lanes are now operational.
- On the Gold Coast Highway, south of Hooker Boulevard to Markeri Street at Mermaid Beach – there are now bus lanes on each side of the highway.

All motorists need to follow the rules for driving in these new lanes, 24 hours a day.



Who can use T3 Transit Lanes?

- Vehicles with three or more occupants
- Public transport buses
- Tourism and courtesy coaches
- Taxis and limousines
- Emergency vehicles
- Bicycles and motorbikes



Who can use the Bus Lanes?

- Public transport buses
- Tourism and courtesy coaches
- Taxis and limousines
- Emergency vehicles
- Bicycles
- Vehicles using kerbside parking with care

All motorists may drive in the T3 or Bus Lane for up to 100 metres to:

- enter or leave a road or driveway
- move across from the side of the road into the general traffic lanes.
