Fast Facts: Queensland Train Manufacturing Program

- The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) has signed za Design Build and Maintain Contract with Downer for the Queensland Train Manufacturing Program (QTMP).
- The program will bring train manufacturing back to Maryborough, continuing a 150 year tradition of building trains in this community.

QTMP - FAQs

Will the trains be built here, or built overseas and assembled here?

The QTMP trains will be built at the Torbanlea Manufacturing Facility.

The facility's capabilities will include steel fabrication, robotic-assisted welding, bogie construction, car body building, electrical manufacturing, equipment fit-out and testing of the completed rollingstock.

While some materials, components and systems will likely need to be obtained from international suppliers, we will be ensuring that as many materials as possible are sourced from Queensland and Australia.

The QTMP trains will be the most accessible trains in Queensland's history. They will feature two accessible toilets, wheelchair allocated spaces, priority seats, braille on signage and hearing loops in all cars.

The QTMP project team is undertaking genuine, early, and comprehensive engagement with the disability sector to ensure a fully compliant fleet of trains that is accessible and functional for all passengers.

Can bikes be taken on the train?



 - Ongoing operation and maintenance of the fleet and rail over fifteen years.
- Features that will be new to these trains include:
 - Train Boarding Bridges to make travel more accessible;
 - Electronic Leveling Control to bring train;
 - Bike Racks on each train;
 - Charging points so that passengers can charge their devices on board.

- I'm pleased to announce we've finalised the procurement process and Downer has been awarded the Design Build and Maintain Contract to deliver the Queensland Train Manufacturing Program.
- Downer's proposal presented strong value for money for taxpayers: a leadingedge, accessible and modern train design, as well as a commitment to reinvest back into the community with jobs and training programs.

QTMP - FAQs

Will the trains be built here, or built overseas and assembled here?

The QTMP trains will be built at the Torbanlea Manufacturing Facility.

The facility's capabilities will include steel fabrication, robotic-assisted welding, bogie construction, car body building, electrical manufacturing, equipment fit-out and testing of the completed rollingstock.

While some materials, components and systems will likely need to be obtained from international suppliers, we will be ensuring that as many materials as possible are sourced from Queensland and Australia.

Why have you previously state \$7.1 billion but the contract value is \$4.6 billion?

The \$7.1 billion that we've stated is an estimate of cost of building and operating the trains. These trains will have an operational life of around 35 years. This contract with Downer covers capital and operational costs over fifteen years only.

How many jobs will be created by the project?

QTMP will create hundreds of jobs and build a long-term sustainable rail supply chain for Queensland.

- The QTMP will support more than 800 jobs here in Maryborough with more jobs in the construction of a stabling and maintenance facility at Ormeau.
- Once operational the maintenance facility will support around 100 ongoing jobs.

When will the first train start services, and when will the entire fleet be in service?

QTMP will help support the service uplift required for Cross River Rail and the 2032 Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The first train is anticipated to be manufactured in 2026, with all trains expected to be in service by 2032.

Will the government keep making trains in Maryborough after the 65 trains are built?

Built into the contract are options for further trains (a further 15). So this contract provides certainty to young pelple in Maryborough and the Hervey Bay region that there will be ongoing manufacturing jobs in this region.

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to manufacturing trains in Queensland. That's why the Torbanlea facility, while it will be built by Downer, will remain the property of the State.

We've designed this program so that when we order our next set of trains the supplier at that time, if it isn't Downer, will be able to fit right in.

Will the trains be ready in time for Cross River Rail and the Olympics?

QTMP will help support the service uplift required after the opening of Cross River Rail and for the 2032 Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The entire QTMP fleet will be in service in time for the 2032 Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Will the trains be fully accessible?

The QTMP trains will be the most accessible trains in Queensland's history. They will feature two accessible toilets, wheelchair allocated spaces, priority seats, braille on signage and hearing loops in all cars.

The QTMP project team is undertaking genuine, early, and comprehensive engagement with the disability sector to ensure a fully compliant fleet of trains that is accessible and functional for all passengers.

Can bikes be taken on the train?

The QTMP trains will include a total of four (4) dedicated bike racks, with two (2) bike racks in the first and last carriages. One (1) bike will be able to be parked in each bike rack.

Does that mean a limit of four bikes per train?

The current policy provides a limit of four or e-scooters per train, two in the front and two in the rear carriage.

There is no limit on the number of bicycles on trains in off peak periods, pending space requirements.

Will QR staff operate the trains?

Absolutely. Similar to the existing New Generation Rollingstock trains, QR staff will operate the trains as guards and drivers.

Will QR maintain the trains?

The contract provides for Down to maintain the fleet at a new, dedicated maintenance facility in Ormeau for 15 years with four, five-year options to extend (up to 35 years in total.

The Queensland Train Manufacturing Program (QTMP) has reached a major milestone, with the recent announcement of Downer being awarded the Design Build Maintain (DBM) Contract to deliver the program.

The QTMP will support South East Queensland's population and economic growth, as well as Cross River Rail and the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games. As part of the program, Downer will deliver 65 six-car passenger trains, a purpose-built manufacturing facility at Torbanlea and a new rail facility for train maintenance and stabling at Ormeau.

The program will bring train manufacturing back to Queensland, supporting more than 800 jobs in the Maryborough region over the term of the contract as well as construction and maintenance jobs at an Ormeau stabling and maintenance facility. The DBM contract is valued at \$4.6 billion over fifteen years, making it the largest rollingstock investment in rail in Queensland's history.

Updates to probity

The DBM contract for QTMP was executed on 29 June 2023. As such the QTMP DBM procurement process has concluded.

In accordance with the DBM contract, the state has a reciprocal obligation to protect project confidential information (which includes information provided by Downer and the state). QTMP confidential information remains confidential (SENSITIVE) and is to be kept on a need-to-know basis.

To ensure appropriate contract management, elected officials are requested not to engage with Downer regarding QTMP, other than through the QTMP State Representative (or delegate). The QTMP DBM contract now reverts to business as usual, and standard obligations as specified in the Public Sector Ethics Act 1994 and the Ministerial Code of Conduct apply.

What's next

Site investigations and early works are underway at the Torbanlea manufacturing facility site and Ormeau rail facility site. Downer will start mobilisation to both sites to set-up site offices and undertake pre-construction activities.

The project team is working on the detailed design of the facilities and passenger trains, with major construction scheduled to commence later this year.

This is an exciting time for our team, stakeholders and communities as the project comes to life.
