Rochedale bus station and park 'n' ride

Pacific Motorway (M1) Eight Mile Plains to Daisy Hill upgrade

The Queensland Government is building a better M1 with the Stage 2 Pacific Motorway (M1) upgrade program between Eight Mile Plains and Daisy Hill (EMP2DH) now in construction.

This \$750 million project is jointly funded by the Australian and Queensland governments.

The Rochedale bus station and park 'n' ride will improve public transport connectivity to local residents by offering a fast and reliable travel alternative to driving, while easing congestion on the M1.

Stage 2 comprises upgrades to eight kilometres of the M1 and is being constructed in four separate packages:

1. Sports Drive to Gateway Motorway
2. Pacific Highway early works
3. Watland Street to Sports Drive
4. Rochedale bus station and park 'n' ride.

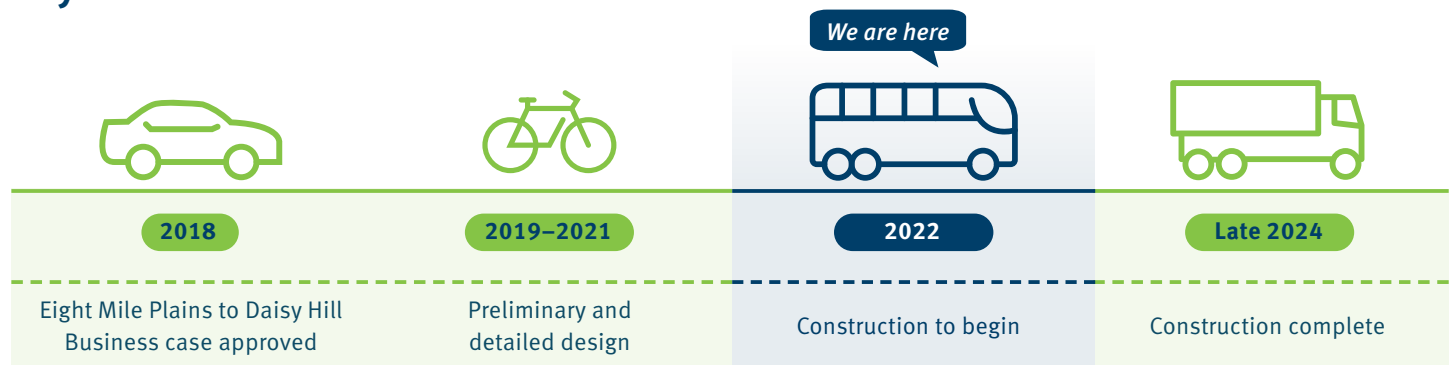
Project features

The Rochedale bus station and park 'n' ride will include:

- bus station at the corner of School and Underwood roads in Rochedale
- park 'n' ride facilities for approximately 485 vehicles, including nine accessible parking spaces
- pedestrian and bicycle connectivity to the bus station
- undercover storage for 30 bicycles.

Detailed design for Rochedale bus station and park 'n' ride was refined following early investigation works and community consultation undertaken in late 2019.

What to expect

With detailed design now complete, construction of the Rochedale bus station and park 'n' ride can now begin.

The civil works phase, expected to begin in mid-2022, will involve a series of enabling works including relocating underground services and the construction of new pavements, retaining walls and drainage.

Once enabling works are complete, construction of the new bus station and park 'n' ride facilities, including drop-off and pick-up bays and entry plaza area, will commence.
